SEPTEMBER - BARBARA OLSON TO TEACH FOR THREE MARYLAND GUILDS!

September 9-10, for Nimble Fingers Guild, "Begin at the End." Quilt borders are often an afterthought. Create a totally integrated small art piece, beginning with a foundation pieced border full of curves and some geometric shapes, then on to the body of the quilt. Machine appliqué and piecing. 9:30-3:30 at the Potomac Community Center, 11315 Falls Road, Potomac, Maryland. \$60 for members, \$70 for non-members. Contact Janet Wildman to register for class.

September 14, for Annapolis Guild, "Fantasy Flowers." You will make a small quilt starting with one of Barbara's flower drawings to create a "fantasy flower." They can be "kinda like chrysanthemums" but use a wonderful variety of multi-colored shaded fabrics. Batiks, hand dyed, painted or marbled fabric and some novelty flowered fabrics work well, but calicos and solids do not. She will also show you how to use decorative threads to add texture. FSQ MEMBER FEATURED IN 'PROFESSIONAL QUILTER' MAGAZINE

The current issue (Summer 2004) of *The Professional Quilter* magazine contains an article written by Lauren Kingsland, FASG member who lives in Gaithersburg, about exhibiting your work in galleries and juried exhibits.

Lauren recently installed in the Gaithersburg Arts Barn a quilt depicting a sycamore tree which was commissioned by the City of Gaithersburg as a sponsorship recognition piece. Donors to the Arts program for the City get a leaf with their name or corporate logo sewn on.

The Washington County (Hagerstown) Hospital chapel is now brighter by the first of three commissioned quilt pieces created by Lauren to be focal points for this ecumenical meditation space. "Divine Fire" is a kaleidoscopic image in blues and glowing red orange, surrounded by pale blue Thai silk, suggesting the light of inspiration that comes through meditation. The chapel is on the 8th floor of the hospital.

Dear Friendship Star Quilters,

Thank you so much for all of your help with my project. With your help I was able to collect over 450 blankets. As I was counting the blankets, I was so impressed by the amount of detail and attention which all of the blankets exhibited. With your help I know this has been an enormously successful drive.

I have now delivered the majority of the blankets to the hospital and the staff there was also blown away by not just the beauty but the time and care put into the blankets. When I brought the blankets to the hospital, they had none in stock. Moments after bringing them into the ward, the nurses had brought a blanket to every single one of the babies and even used them to decorate the incubators of the babies who could not yet be exposed. Many of the doctors and nurses were brought to tears by the magnitude of your generosity, knowing truly the ordeal that the mothers of these babies must go through, especially when the odds of the baby's survival are often against them.

FSQ 2005 QUILT SHOW CHALLENGE, "IT'S A SMALL WORLD" Chairs: Sandy DeLaney, Mary Jo Haczewski, Wendy Bauman

The challenge is twofold:

- to interpret the show theme
- to incorporate the preselected challenge fabrics

The interpretation of the theme is ALL up to the individual but you MUST follow the challenge guide lines.

The challenge fabrics (all 4) must be incorporated into the top of the quilt in recognizable/visible amounts. You may add any additional fabrics and embellishments that you want to your design.

The FINISHED size must be 42" x 42". This size will allow us to submit entries for the AQS Best Ultimate Guild Challenge and be represented in both Nashville and Paducah if we win.

If you have no clue in what direction to go with the theme, here are a few examples:

- small habitats
- world cultures
- animal kingdoms
- microscopic visions
- miniature blocks
- geographic subjects

We have made the directions for this challenge as simple as possible. We are hoping that we have made this challenge interesting enough for ALL, from the novice to the experienced quilter. We are presenting this to you early in case you need time to collect your thoughts, fabrics, and ideas.

There is a limited amount of challenge fabric kits, so sign-up and purchasing your fabric kits is on a first come basis. We will have the kits available at the August meeting. Your guidelines will be included in the kit. The cost of the challenge fabric kit is \$3.00. The deadline will be announced at a later date (close to show time).
