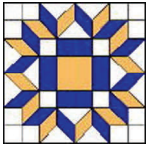

children in residence at Villa Maria in Timonium. The charities were chosen by the women and the quilts are their way of giving back to the community.

These quilters only have access to a sewing machine on Friday afternoons when volunteers visit to provide quilting supplies and assistance. The majority of the quilts are pieced and quilted by hand in the residents' rooms where only one needle and thread are allowed.

The women design their own quilts or choose to

quilt a panel. The hand piecing, applique and hand quilting on the quilts was exceptional. Two of the quilts won ribbons at the Howard County Fair this year.

We will again be collecting a **non-refundable** \$50 deposit for the FSQ Retreat at Rhodes Grove Camp and Conference Center in Chambersburg, Pennsylvania. ### Comfort Cases for Foster Children

We wanted to share this amazing photo of the **61 fleece blankets** finished at the Service Projects workshop on November 19. They are for a project started by a member of Fairhaven United Methodist Church, which has generously provided storage and work space for us to meet. Rob Chasteen, himself a former foster child, has fostered and then adopted 4 children, 2 sets of siblings. He remembers arriving at his first foster home carrying all his belongings in a garbage bag, as did his own children when they arrived at his home.

Rob has enlisted the church's help to create "comfort cases" to give to each new foster child entering the system through the National Center for Families and Children in Bethesda. They would consist of a backpack/duffel bag/small suitcase packed with a fleece blanket, new PJs, a small stuffed animal, toiletries, etc. Jane Phillips, who is a member of both FSQ and the church, reached out to us to help with the project, and got us so well organized that day that we were able not only to complete these 61 fleece blankets, but also continue our regular work tying and binding quilts.

We will continue to work on this project every couple of months since foster children continue to enter the system and need the warmth and comfort these blankets provide.

If you'd like to help with this project we'd love to have donations of fleece appropriate for infants through teens, as well as ribbon (at least 1/2" wide) to tie up the blankets.

If you'd like to make blankets yourself and donate them, these are the sizes we made. They are approximations, so feel free to vary them.

- infant sized, 26 x 30
- small, 30 x 40
- medium 40 x 50, or full width of fleece (58) large 50 x 60, or full width of fleece (58)

You can finish the edge by folding and then using a decorative stitch, or you can just cut the edge with a decorative rotary cutter. We found the folded and sewn edge was a bit less stretchy, but the important point is that the children have something warm, cuddly and new to take with them.
