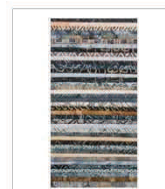

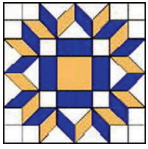

to snow.

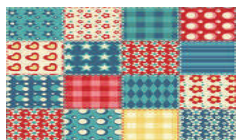

- encouraged all members to both volunteer and participate in the FSQ show by attending and submitting quilts to display and other items to sell.
- FSQ quilt show flyers were given to guild members to place at quilt shops, bulletin boards, and other places where potential quilt show attendees can see them. (Contact: Rosie Hormuth)
  - The co-chairs of the boutique committee encouraged members to make items to sell in the boutique at the 2015 FSQ show and announced that they had the registration forms available in the lobby. To participate you must pay \$5, fill out a form (also available on the FSQ website) and return it to Mary or Suma, and sign-up to work two to four hours in the boutique. The \$5 registration fee and 10% of sale proceeds benefit the FSQ guild. (Contacts: [Mary Moore Payne](#) and [Suma Glassman](#))
  - It was announced that the next quilt show meeting would be held on January 6<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 pm. NOTE: Due to snow, the meeting was subsequently rescheduled to January 13<sup>th</sup> at Dottie Acton's home. (Contact: Diana Marshall and Barbara Kilby)
  - The Milltown Quilters sold raffle tickets for their quilt in the lobby before and during the meeting.
  - Members were invited to sign up for sit-and-sew sessions scheduled for Thursday, February 19<sup>th</sup>, and Sunday, May 17<sup>th</sup>, at the Hampton Inn & Suites from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Each session can accommodate 12 people and costs \$20. (Contact: Pat Vasao)
  - JoAnne Duchez, Programs chair, presented the results of December's question-of-the-month pertaining to guild-sponsored workshops. (Details are available in January's *Quiltline* newsletter.) JoAnne discussed the issue of weak attendance at workshops and said she would recommend to the FSQ board that only one workshop, featuring a well-known presenter, be held each year.
  - Dottie Acton said she would send out an email announcement of the date, time, and place of the next board meeting. Any member is welcome to attend board meetings.
  - Joanne Duchez announced that this year's yard sale is scheduled to be held after the June guild meeting. The yard sale makes money for the guild by reselling donated quilting and sewing items. Donations for the yard sale will start being collected at the February 2015 guild meeting. Members are reminded to place their donations in the correct collection box, i.e., don't confuse the yard sale donation box with the quilt show raffle basket donation box! (Contact: Joanne Duchez)
  - Janice Pope of "Anything But Boring" in Raleigh, NC, gave a presentation of bags and quilts she has designed. Patterns and tools were available for sale in the lobby. (Contact: [www.anythingbutboring.com](http://www.anythingbutboring.com))
  - After a break, a drawing was held for the fat quarter of the month. Information on the fat-quarter-of-the-month fabrics is provided in the *Quiltline* newsletter. Members who donate fat quarters before guild meetings may enter the drawing. January's winners were Susan Schwarz and Cathy Berman.
  - Members displayed their latest quilting accomplishments in show and tell.
  - Meeting attendees may enter their names in a box at the front of the meeting room to win door prizes. Entries are drawn at the end of the meeting and you must be present to win. Winners of January's door prizes were Cathie Shelton, Danee Wilson, Susan Schwarz, Connie Ross, Carole Weichert, and Susan Spencer.

### Mission

### **VOLUNTEERS – Anne Flaggs**

It takes many hands to put on a quilt show. WE NEED YOU! The jobs include quilt take in, show setup, admissions, white gloving, service projects, silent auction, raffle ticket sales, fabric giveaway, and show take-down. You can also provide security, or sign up your spouse or high school student for this job. Most jobs are in 2 hour increments, so you can find something that fits your schedule. If you sign up by the April FSQ meeting for at least 4 hours of service (not necessarily in one sitting) and fulfill that commitment, you'll be entered in the drawing for the coveted Volunteers Bonus Basket, and you will get free admission for the entire show. 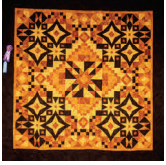
### **QUILT REGISTRATION – Karen Moss**

Your top priorities from now until March 2 are to finish your show quilts and send your quilt registration

forms and photos to **Karen Moss**. Send them electronically if possible, or turn them in to Karen at the March 2 FSQ meeting. If you're not finished with your quilt by March 2, but expect to finish it by April 18, you may submit a picture of the pattern or the quilt in progress, along with a completed registration form. ### **THE FSQ ULTIMATE GUILD CHALLENGE – Ellen Robinson**

**“Getting From Point A to Point B”** – This is all about maps, but it is YOUR interpretation of a map. It can be based upon a traditional navigation block, such as a Mariner's Compass, or a free form art quilt, or anything in between, so long as it represents a map. Rules are on the FSQ website and the deadline to turn in your quilt is **Monday, March 2, 2015**. Eight quilts will be selected to compete in the national AQS contest.

I have regular customers and it's great to get a little cash back – I get to buy more quilting things! The registration fee is a modest \$5, plus a 10% commission to the guild – you keep 90%. ### **HOSPITALITY – Carol Unger and Eleanor Bragin**

We will serve breakfast, lunch, and snacks to the vendors and volunteers at the quilt show, and FSQ members are asked to donate food and paper goods. **Cash donations are also welcome.**

We will have a sign-up sheet at FSQ meetings and at Service Project Workshops, and are already collecting paper goods and other non-perishable donations. See **Carol Unger and Eleanor Bragin** for a list of menu items and other goods you can contribute.

### **SERVICE PROJECTS – Anne Weaver and Nancy Brennan**

Service Projects will host a **Sit & Sew** at the quilt show from 11am to 4pm on Saturday, April 25, 2015. We will invite Quilt Show guests to help tie charity quilts, and we will provide instruction for those who are new at this. We'll display photos of our workshops and distribute printed information about the charities we support.

We also invite FSQ members to enter the **Service Project Challenge, “The Sky’s the Limit.”** Quilts can range from baby size (36” x 36”) up to twin size. The quilt top must include some recognizable blue and white. Challenge quilts will be donated to Fisher House or the Betty Ann Krahnke Center. More details are available on the FSQ quilt show website. Use the FSQ Registration form and enter by March 2 to participate.

### **SILENT AUCTION – Alice Washburn and Barbara Skelly**

Do you have any UFOs that you can finish and place in our quilt show’s Silent Auction? Small quilts or quilt-related items that you’d like to sell? Set your own price. You keep 70%; FSQ keeps 30%. A photograph (4x6) must accompany each item. Complete guidelines can be found on the FSQ website, and items will be collected on April 18 when Show quilts are turned in.
