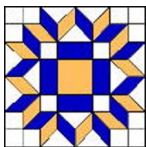

I don't know if you get *Quilters Newsletter* as I have for years and year, but I was totally caught off guard by the announcement in the Oct/Nov 2016 issue that the *QN* would cease print publication as of that issue. The website, quiltersnewsletter.com will continue and those with subscriptions will receive *Quilting Arts* magazine, starting in December.

Quilters Newsletter started in 1969 by Bonnie and George Leman. Bonnie composed the first issue, as so many of us did in those days, on a manual typewriter. As a magazine devoted solely to the art and craft of quilting, *Quilters Newsletter* was unique for its time. *QN* was also essential to revitalizing the art of quilting that had fallen out of favor as a pastime and art in the 1960s. *QN* was devoted to not only to the art of quilt making, but the history of quilts and their creators.

I probably started reading *QN* in the 1980s, but I occasionally picked up older issues to see what info I could glean from it. I always found *QN* informative, whether it was about a quilter, a technique or, pattern. I will miss *QN*. I enjoyed the columnists' essays on the history of quilts or their own history with quilts. I'll miss the variety of patterns and quilt makers featured in each issue. Goodbye *QN*, see you on your website.

I'm also wishing goodbye to summer. I'm writing this on the equinox with "*The summer's almost gone/The winter's tuning up*" as Leonard Cohen said. 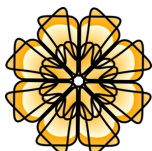
