If you'd like to be part of the fun, there are several ways to participate. Bring some of your orphan blocks to the Novewmber meeting; Select an orphan block of your choice from our stockpile of orphan blocks; or use your own orphan block(s).

Your task is to build a quilt around your orphan block(s). The quilt size should be at least 36" square, or up to a twin size quilt.

The completed quilt is due for the December meeting. The guild will vote at the holiday party, deciding which quilt makes best use of the orphan blocks.

Winners receive Yard Sale bucks, and all quilts will be donated to Service Projects. It's a win-win proposition!



Service Projects Update

Many of you ask, "Where does Service Projects donate quilts?" In the September newsletter, we highlighted Fisher House. This month we will profile Mary's Center for Maternal and Child Care, www.maryscenter.org. This non-profit organization operates medical centers in Silver Spring and five other locations in DC and Prince George's County. Mary's Center was established in 1988 to provide health care, education, and social services to uninsured and under-insured clients. It also provides child development services, home visits for pregnant women and infants, teen pregnancy prevention programs, and school dropout prevention programs.

Service Projects provides baby quilts for their quarterly educational baby showers. Pregnant women due that quarter are invited to a shower to hear from a guest speaker, receive baby supplies, choose a quilt, and have refreshments. The new moms are excited to be able to pick out a beautiful new quilt for their baby!

These are the topics discussed at the October FSQ Executive Board Meeting. As you can see, we have a lot of interesting topics and discussions.

Avoiding Dark and Winding Roads: Several of our members have said that they would prefer to avoid dark and winding roads to get to our meeting site. One way to do that is to use Montgomery Village Avenue instead of some of the alternatives. Just take Montgomery Village Avenue to its end at Wightman Road. Turn right on Wightman, and at the next light, turn left onto Goshen Road. Warfield Road is just 0.3 miles further. This eliminates the long drive on Goshen, which can be no fun at night!

Suggestions for Improving FSQ: We had six individuals respond to the September question of the month regarding what they would like to have changed to improve our guild. Here are the suggestions and the response from the board.

Get a wireless microphone for the speakers. We contacted the church and they will be providing a wireless microphone for future meetings.

Have more mini groups. We have added three groups this year. Contact Nicki Lynch to join the miniature quilts group, Susan Entwistle to join the wool applique group or Kathy Brown to join the new group with a focus on fun and friendship. If anyone would like to form an additional group, please contact Nicki Lynch. Also, if you are in a group and your group has openings, please let Nicki know so she can help find new members for your group.

Have an annual quilt show. We brought this question up for a vote in 2013, and a clear majority voted for shows every other year. Our membership is too low to support an annual show. However, you could consider joining a second group that has a show on the even number years.

Have national teacher workshops. Our budget limitations make it difficult to bring in a nationally known speaker on our own. In addition, we have had problems filling workshops for the past few years. We will look at coordinating with other local guilds to share the cost of bringing in nationally known speakers.

Block of the month with show and tell every month. If anyone would like to volunteer to do this, please contact Dottie Acton. Otherwise it probably won't happen.

Bring a friend. Good idea! Please bring a friend to the January meeting. There will be no guest fee and we have an interesting speaker that evening.

Raffle Quilt Ticket Sales: We sold 728 tickets at Oaks and 78 additional tickets have been turned in by members. Sixty three of our members have sold tickets or picked up their packets. We will be having a drawing every month for the tickets turned in to date, so turn in your tickets soon to win a small prize. We have another good opportunity to sell tickets at Capital Quilts during Quilt Quest. At the November meeting, we will be asking for additional volunteers to staff our sales table at CQ. We have about half of the available hours covered so far.

Guild Secretary Position: Billye Roberts has had to resign as guild secretary, so we are looking for a volunteer for this position. If you are interested in serving as secretary, please contact Dottie Acton before or at the November meeting.

FSQ Publicity: We are working on improving our Facebook and Website presence. Watch for more information in the next few months. If you have suggestions on other ways to share information about our guild, please contact Dottie Acton.

Treasurers' Report: Barbara Kilby and Barbara Dryden presented the treasurers report to the board, and are preparing a user friendly budget report for our members, along with figures for the fiscal year ended May 31, 2015.

Quilt Insurance: We currently have our raffle quilt insurance through the National Quilters Association, but that organization is dissolving at the end of the year. Therefore we are investigating other alternatives. Our liability insurance policy is not affected.

Our next FSQ Executive Board Meeting will be at Dottie's house on December 15, at 7PM. All guild members are invited to attend, and committee chairs are encouraged to attend.

.The meeting was called to order by FSQ president, Dottie Acton. Minutes of the September meeting were approved as published.

Announcements:

The next board meeting is October 13 at 7 pm at Dottie Acton's home. All are welcome to attend. Please let Dottie know if you plan to attend or have an item for discussion.

The Clustered Spires Quilt Guild is selling tickets for their raffle quilt in the lobby.

Service Projects meets this Thursday. There are preemie kits and kids' quilt tops ready to be quilted in the back of sanctuary.

Envelopes of raffle tickets for the FSQ raffle quilt are available for pickup in the lobby. Members are asked to sell at least one envelope's worth of 30 tickets or \$25. The amount was increased from last year due to the decrease in membership. There is a photo of the quilt on the web site currently in the photo gallery but it will be placed in a more prominent location soon. Kathy Brown will be providing monthly prizes for raffle ticket sellers.

Members are asked to sign up to sell raffle tickets at Capital Quilts during Quilters Quest.

Payments for the 2016 retreat are due tonight. See Judy Walsh or Teresa Peterson.

Dottie Acton's small group has openings. Nicki Lynch is starting a small group for making mini-quilts and has openings. Contact them if you are interested. Susan Entwistle would like to start a small group for wool appliqué. A sign-up sheet is at the library table. Susan will then contact interested parties to determine the best time to meet.

Karen Moss described the AQS Guild Challenge called "What Does Modern Mean to You"? It is based on the 2015 Pantone color of the year called Marsala. A minimum of ten square inches of fabric in the color must be used. She had packets with information available at the meeting.

Jane Phillips talked about her ongoing project to make no-sew fleece blankets for kids. There is a packing party on November 21. Contact Jane if you want to attend. There is a workshop on October 14 at Fairhaven church to make blankets from the remaining 80 bolts of fleece. They will meet from 9:30 am to 6:30 pm on the 14th and the next day from 9:30 to 12:30.

Programs:

Joanne DuChez announced the orphan block challenge. You may select one of your own of the program committee had some available at the programs table. You are to build a quilt around it. Size is from 36" square up to twin size. They are due at the December meeting. Prizes are FSQ cash for the 2016 yard sale. Quilts will be donated to service projects.

JoAnne then announced our guest speaker Annette Ornelas who gave a trunk show highlighting her dimensional curves technique.

Show and Tell followed a break.

November – Fat quarters of Winter or Holiday Fabric in Blues, Whites, and/or Silver.

December -- Service Project Special. 12" Nine Patch Block. Corners and center in shades of blue or purple, the other squares in white, off-white or beige. For every block you make for the raffle, please make a second block to be given to Service Projects. If you need a pattern to follow see:

Note: The pattern gives you a block that measures 12 ½ inches, resulting in a 12 inch finished block when sewn into a quilt.

January – Fat quarters of Geometric prints: circles, squares, dots, stripes, etc.

February – Pre-cut Batik strips 2 ½ inches by width of fabric (4 strips equal one entry in the raffle).

March – Fat quarters of Green and/or Yellow

April – Fat quarters of Floral Prints to Celebrate Spring.

May – Fat quarters of Black and/or White -- Coffee and/or Cream

June – Fat quarters of Patriotic or Red, White and/or Blue
