#### **Guild Minutes: November 2015 FSQ Meeting**

Last month's minutes were approved.

Members were asked to sign up for a shift to sell tickets for our opportunity quilt at Capitol Quilts during Quilters' Quest, and to pick up tickets to sell individually as well. Members were also asked to pick up a kit to finish for Service Projects.

Members were also asked to respond to the Question of the Month - Are there any particular speakers (preferably within 300 miles) or topics that members would like to hear? President Dottie Acton noted that the Question of the Month is available in our monthly Newsletter.

Dottie also noted that our currently elected secretary has had to resign, and asked for volunteers to serve as secretary.

The FSQ holiday party is held at the December meeting. Michele Barnard asked members to bring something to share: sweet or savory treat, or beverages. Paper products, etc. will be provided. There was little interest in a gift exchange, so there will be NO gift exchange for 2016- only good cheer and a celebration of friendship in the holiday season.

Next month's fabric exchange is a block exchange: nine-patches. Blocks should be 12" finished; 12.5" unfinished, blues or purples (corners and centers) and whites to beiges. Bring TWO blocks – one to swap, one for Service Projects.

Nancy Colladay and Karen Moss are co-chairing the 2016 AQS Ultimate Guild Challenge – details are on the FSQ website! FSQ registration forms are due at the February 1 guild meeting; finished quilts and entry forms are due by the March 7 guild meeting. In answer to questions about the required use of color, AT LEAST 10 square inches must be recognizable (but you can use more); mottled or print fabrics can be used; and you can use a variety of fabrics that add up to 10 inches of the qualifying color.

JoAnne Duchez reminded us of the orphan block challenge due in December, and introduced our speaker, Mary Kerr. We were treated to a talk and trunk show on "Hexies through History."

After our break, many lovely projects were shown for Show and Tell.

The ticket sales drawing was won by Phyllis Eddy.

The fabric exchange drawing was won by Dottie Acton.

Door prizes were won by Diane Heller, Carol Carrier, Linda Belecki, and Meg Tison.




# Service Projects Update

## Wanted: Ideas for the 2017 Raffle quilt

Do you have an idea for a big beautiful quilt? We are now seeking proposals for a queen-size raffle quilt to be made by FSQ members. This is a great project for a small committee or a mini-group to coordinate.

We would plan to distribute kits and directions in February or March 2016. Blocks typically are made by dozens of FSQ members, and assembly can be done by two or three people. The quilt top needs to be complete by June 2016 so that it can be machine quilted and bound during the summer months.

In August 2016 we will enter the raffle quilt in the County Fair. Then we take the quilt on the road to sell tickets. Finally, we'll hold the Grand Prize Drawing at our Biennial Quilt Show April 28-30, 2017.



**December --** Service Project Special. 12" Nine Patch Block. Corners and center in shades of blue or purple, the other squares in white, off-white or beige. For every block you make for the raffle, please make a second block to be given to Service Projects. If you need a pattern to follow see:

Note: The pattern gives you a block that measures 12 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> inches, resulting in a 12 inch finished block when sewn into a quilt.

January – Fat quarters of Geometric prints: circles, squares, dots, stripes, etc.

**February** – Pre-cut Batik strips 2 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> inches by width of fabric (4 strips equal one entry in the raffle).

March - Fat quarters of Green and/or Yellow

**April** – Fat quarters of Floral Prints to Celebrate Spring.

May – Fat quarters of Black and/or White -- Coffee and/or Cream

June – Fat quarters of Patriotic or Red, White and/or Blue
