#### President's Message

Our upcoming meeting comes with a lot of feeling, being on September 11<sup>th</sup>.

I remember where I was on September 11<sup>th</sup> 2001 when the Towers came down. I'm sure most of you do as well. I remember how we all came together in helping the people of New York City, which is still recovering. I remember the quilts that were made to commemorate those who died and the First Responders who worked to save them. The world changed for Americans that day and we should remember that.

That remembrance leads me to Houston, and much of the Texas Gulf coast, which is a disaster area due to Hurricane Harvey and the subsequent horrendous flooding. I know people are concerned about that area of Texas and what can be done to help the people there. There is also concern about the International Quilt Festival scheduled for November 2-5 in Houston. While I didn't have plans to go (as much as I'd like to), I have doubts if the city will be recovered enough to welcome the thousands of quilters as it has in the past. Quilt Market Houston is October 28th -30th, just before the International Quilt Festival and is probably also in doubt. This is a major event for all the quilt shops as well as the hundreds of vendors, and the people in the Houston area whose livelihoods depend on the people the convention center brings in. Keep a good thought for the people of Houston and the rest of the flooded region.

I'm a bit sad that our Guild will not be participating in the Pennsylvania National Quilt Extravaganza, a.k.a. Oaks. We participated in the Pennsylvania National Quilt Extravaganza for a number of years, even before it moved to Oaks. Unfortunately, it was decided at the last meeting that we wouldn't be participating this year. This means that we will have to work twice as hard to sell raffle quilt tickets to make up for what we would have made at Oaks. Please consider volunteering to visit the regional Guilds with the quilt to sell tickets or to the various group you may be in contact with. The sale of these tickets provides the Guild with the funds it needs for a place to meet and programming.

Speaking of programming, I am always in awe of the skill and expertise of quilters in the region, whether they are in FSQ or not. This was apparent at the Montgomery County Agricultural Fair. I would like programming in future years – as I know this next year is set – to consider looking for and asking local quilters to talk about some of their techniques. I'd like to know how to print labels using my printer and how to work with wool, for example. It would be good to have a local quilter who isn't part of the Guild to talk to us about an unfamiliar technique. We might even get a new member! If you have a technique you saw at the Fair, please put a note about it in the suggestion box at the meeting.

I don't know if everyone knows this, but our web page is looking different these days. Our raffle quilt is prominently displayed as well as an announcement for the next meeting. Thank you Lorie, for your continuing work on the website and to promote the Guild!!

Finally, my godson published his first book! He used CreateSpace for publishing and has it available in eBook from on Amazon. His name is Alex Scott and the book is **Thresholds of the Grand Dream**. He has a few short stories on his page on Amazon.

Since the beginning of June, we delivered **50 quilts** to Warm Up America for distribution to local hospitals, **18 quilts** to Fisher House, **30 quilts** to Healthy Families Montgomery, **172 preemie quilts** to Holy Cross for their NICU, and **21 quilts** to Mary's Center for their quarterly education baby shower. Our contact with Mary's Center, Amy Shannon, sent this lovely email.

I hope you all come to the September meeting to travel through Indonesia with Judy Gula! Judy, owner of Artistic Artifacts located in Alexandria, loves to share her knowledge and textile travel experience. Her goal is to empowering others to create their own artwork. Artistic Artifacts is a Fair Trade importer of creative art supplies from around the world: Australia, Indonesia, India, Thailand, Vietnam and the United States.

Judy's lecture topic is *Batik Adventure.* The presentation begins with a 35-minute computer slide show includes photos of Indonesia culture and the many batik processes. The discussion will focus on how Indonesian fabrics are created, including beautiful hand-drawn batik panels, batik fabric yardage, and sarongs. At the conclusion of the slideshow, there will be a variety of batik fabrics and other Indonesian textiles to see and handle. A mini trunk show of art quilts created with these wonderful batiks and panels will also be included.

FSQ on Pinterest Lorie Coston

Think of a cork board and push pins! And photographs of interesting things.

**Pinterest** is a social network that allows users to visually share interests by posting (known as 'pinning') images to their own or other boards and browsing what other users have pinned. Boards are typically theme based. Browse and pin what you like to your account boards or the guild's boards. Think of a cork board and push pins!

You may create an account for free. It's easy. Follow the prompts and answer the questions. You can use your real name or make up details—it's fine. There will not be a quiz. If you have a Facebook account, you may use your username and password to access Pinterest—no need to remember yet another password.

The guild's account may be accessed at this link: <u>https://www.pinterest.com/</u> then create your account if you don't have one. Use the Search feature typing Friendship Star Quilters Gaithersburg. Look around and see what others are pinning. If you see something you like, pin it to your own board.

You may Pin any image. Here is how:

Roll your mouse over an image.

Look for a red rectangle to appear with a push pin symbol and the word Save.

Click the red rectangle with your mouse.

Choose to which board you would like to save the image by scrolling with your mouse.

Create a board by clicking Create. Give the board a title. Click Create.

It's easy! You have saved your first pin.

Guild members are granted access to most boards on our page and can pin related items to each board.\* Small Groups have their own boards and only members of each group may post items to their board. It's all in good fun! So get pinning and sharing your ideas and see what others find interesting!
