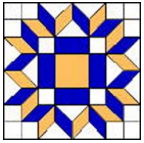

President's Message

Happy New Year! May it be better than 2017, which was chaotic. I'm hoping things settle into a more peaceful atmosphere. With no quilt show for FSQ, I'm looking for inspiration to keep me interested in more than just the ordinary.

One of the best ways I know to get that different perspective is to get out of the house and **do** things. We are fortunate to live in an area that has plenty of places to go, things to see, and things to do.

My husband and I decided it's been too long since we went into D.C. and visited to a museum or two.

The Friday *Post* has a list of what's happening at all the museums. While I'd like to see the zoo again, it's too cold to stroll the pathways. So we decided to do inside things. Of the four things I wanted to do, we decided to do two of them and see how we felt. So the first was the National Geographic Museum, on 17th Street. The big exhibit there is the interactive exhibition, Tomb of Christ. It was pretty impressive for the small space the museum has. The exhibit starts with a talk about the city of Jerusalem and the three holy sites in it. The talk then moves into another room where, having put on 3D glasses, the visitor is given a virtual tour of the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. It's dazzling and dizzying. The woman in front of me almost fell over during one swoop. I had to keep reminding myself I was standing on the floor and *everything else* was moving.

Being the Nat Geo, it concentrated on the restoration done by their team in the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. After the 3D tour, the rest was a detailed explanation of the methods used in the restoration. It was very impressive and interesting. I was slightly disappointed it was just one of the three holy sites; I was ready to tour the Temple Mount and Haram al-Sharif as well!

The other exhibit (it's a small building) was Wild: Michael Nichols, a wild life photographer. His photos are breathtaking, especially the ones of giant trees, and the equipment he uses to get the photos was interesting. I thought back to the lecture we had on using photos for quilts. His would have been very interesting to use.

We then walked to one of my favorite museums, the Renwick. It's collection of contemporary art always dazzles me. The special exhibit is *Murder Is Her Hobby: Frances Glessner Lee and the Nutshell Studies of Unexplained Death*. It runs through January, so if you want to see it, hustle on down. Her Nutshell collection (which is NOT made from nutshells) was/is the basis of modern CSI and criminal investigation. Very impressive and a little frustrating, as none of the scenes has a resolution, just a general sketch of what happened. The Nutshell collection is still being used in training investigators, so the solutions are not revealed. If you like dollhouses, and I do, the work and detail is incredible, as is the life of the woman who made them.

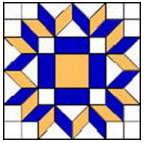
I've saved the best for last – the contemporary craft pieces in the Museums collection. All are intriguing, but what really caught my attention (and one guard who points it out to all visitors) was the work by Sabrina Gschwandtner. The piece we saw was *Fibers and Civilization* (1959) and it just blew my mind. (If you go to the Renwick website, her piece, *Hula Hoop*, is featured.) I had Rich take a picture of it.

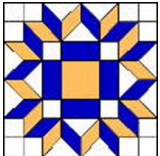

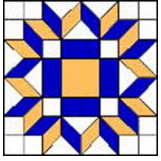
Every year Friendship Star Quilters adopts a charity to receive part of the proceeds from our raffle quilt. This year we voted to select Equipment Connections for Children, a small local organization where our contribution will be well used and appreciated.

The mission of Equipment Connections for Children (ECFC) is to connect costly adaptive equipment from children with disabilities who outgrow the equipment to other children who need it. ECFC solicits donated equipment, refurbishes it if necessary, and matches it at no charge to families with a child with a disability who needs the equipment.

Several FSQ members attended the grand opening of ECFC's new headquarters near the Montgomery County Air Park in October 2017. It was a great opportunity to display our 2018 raffle quilt, "Butterflies in the Mist." The quilt was warmly received, and many of the guests at the event were generous ticket buyers. In the new ECFC warehouse we saw specialized walkers, strollers, gait trainers, tricycles, and other items that can be very expensive to buy and are seldom adequately covered by insurance.

ECFC is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization based in Montgomery County, Maryland, providing hope, mobility, and independence to children all over the metropolitan DC area.
