September Guild Minutes

President, Barbara Kilby, called the meeting to order and welcomed visitors and new members.

A change in the minutes of the August 6th, 2018 meeting. The Annual Audit was completed by Judy Walsh and Joy Dorman, who reviewed the financial statements for Fiscal 2017-18. Former Treasurer Jennifer Rossmere was congratulated on receiving a clean report. Otherwise the minutes were accepted as printed in the newsletter.

Barbara also announced that the next Monthly meeting would be held on Oct. 1st and executive board meeting would be held on Oct 9th.

The FSQ 2019 Raffle Quilt, "Oh My Stars!" was presented/Displayed for FSQ members.

Representatives from Clustered Spires Quilt Guild, (Frederick MD), were introduced as visitors along with their fundraising Raffle Quilt and Raffle Baskets displayed in the foyer.

A donation of \$900 to Equipment Connections for Children was presented by Founder/Program director, Claire Wong and Executive Director, Jason Herring. They thanked the guild for all their hard work and generous donation.

Quilt Show Co-Chairs Connie Ross and Teresa Peterson announced the next meeting as Sept 18 at 7 PM which will be located at Asbury Methodist Village, 400 Russell Ave., Gaithersburg, MD 20877. Quilt Show dates will be April 26-28, 2019 with set up on the 25th. They also asked for volunteers for open positions and for those who held positions last year to confirm they would assist in those positions once again.

Anne Weaver, Service Projects, announced that the next monthly meeting will be held on Sept 20th, from 9:30 AM to Noon at 12801 Darnestown Road, Gaithersburg, MD 20878. This month Service Projects donated 63 baby quilts to Warm Up America, which distributes them to area hospitals. She also announced that, during the break, stop by and pick up a kit of 9 patch squares to make a quilt top.

Judy Walsh, Membership Chairperson, provided a dues reminder and provided membership statistics. She also reported that the Membership Directory was to be published in October and those whose dues are not paid would not be included in the directory.

Karen Moss, the Opportunity Quilt Ticket Chair, announced that raffle tickets were available in the lobby for fundraising. She requested proposal submissions for the 2020 Raffle Quilt design ideas and stated that there were proposal examples available to ease the process. She announced that Raffle Tickets for the 2019 Raffle quilt are available to pick up at any meeting and to see her or a back-up member in the lobby.

JoAnne DuChez made two announcements the first was that the Strip tease Challenge quilts are due at the October FSQ monthly meeting, and second is that there is an open position as the Yard Sale coordinator. Following this, she announced the speaker, Ricki Selva.

After the speaker's presentation, we had Show and Tell. Door Prizes were presented to Suma Glassman, Zulienne Wolfrey, and Jan Baweja. This was followed by Fat Quarter drawing presented to Gerda Sherwood, Kathy Brown and Lorie Coston. The meeting adjourned at 9:10 PM.
