

President's Message

Dottie Acton

Well, it's official – winter is on its way. Our indoor cats have caught two mice, there are acorns all over the sidewalk, and ladybugs, stink bugs and huge flies are all trying to get inside before they freeze. And our quilt show is now only six months away! I know that sounds like forever, but if we want to have the best show ever, we all need to start quilting and volunteering now. Please sign up to sell raffle quilt tickets at Capital Quilts in November. (See details on how to sign up later in the newsletter.) It's a good opportunity to socialize with other quilters, and maybe do some hand sewing or shopping if sales are slow.

Efficiency experts tell us that having a lot of work in progress is a bad idea. If we have a lot of projects underway, we should complete the work using the ‘weighted shortest job first’ approach to maximize the value of the work we do. While quilting isn’t about efficiency, I’m trying to apply the concepts to the many projects that I have underway. For me, the weighting is often driven by deadlines - when I have homework for my once a month class, that is almost always the highest priority project, so I do it and get it out of the way. Obviously making the challenge quilts will become very high priority in January and February, and I’ll try to do the fastest one first. When there is no looming deadline, the pinned quilts go to the top of the list – I want to get them done and not

leave pins in them forever. I’ll do the smallest, easiest quilt first, and then the more complex ones. Sleeves and labels always come in last for me, so I know that March is going to be a tough month for my hands. For all the quilts I do in the future, I’m going to make the sleeves and labels before I start another quilt. I don’t think I want to get to the point where I only have one quilt in progress at a time, but right now I have six quilts, a tree skirt, a Christmas stocking, three embroidery projects and a knit blanket in various stages of completion, and I haven’t even started the challenge quilts yet! I have to finish something.

Of course, one of the beauties of quilting is that there is no requirement to finish everything – I am finally liberated enough to throw away or donate blocks I don’t like. I used to think that throwing away a block or two was waste, but now I accept it as part of the creative process, and it makes more room for other projects that might be more fun.

The experts also say that inventory is waste – and I definitely won’t listen to them there. I love my fabric and thread stash.

Enjoy quilting, experimenting, and even finishing your quilts.



The *kolam* is drawn each morning at the doorway as an invocation of blessing and to beautify the home. Special designs with bright colors are created for festive occasions. There are literally thousands of traditional designs, passed from mother to daughter, plus original designs being created all the time.

There are certain parallels to our creative work as quilters, rooted in domestic tradition, but a tool for creative expression today.
