Service Projects Update

This is the season for generosity toward those in need and also gratitude for what we have and for those who make our lives richer. This is the perfect time of the year to take a look at the numbers of items we have donated to babies, children, and adults in our community who are in need of some extra warmth and comfort. Since the first of June, only 5 short months, we have donated the following:

204 Quilts

126 Preemie Quilts

73 Preemie Hats

107 Pillowcases

Of course, this would not be possible without the generous help of a large network of volunteers and for them we are truly grateful. We have volunteers who have

organized donated fabric by color and by length, volunteers who regularly make up kits for pillowcases and quilt tops, volunteers who come to workshops to tie quilts, stitch on binding, and those who do whatever needs to be done. Then, there are those of you who bring quilts, preemies, and fabric to guild meetings. We certainly couldn't achieve these great numbers without all of you – and for you we are grateful!

The Bloomin' Challenge started with FSQ's 2005 Quilt Show. It was the brainchild of Coralyn Colladay and Karen Walker, members of FSQ. Through the generosity of Karen's business, *Quilter's Confectionery*, she donated the fabric for this challenge. The fabric always had a floral aspect in the design, hence the name, *Bloomin' Challenge*. Karen donated the fabric for the annual show challenges through the 2012 quilt show after which, she retired. For the next two quilt shows, 2013 and 2015, Juanita Canfield, an FSQ member and owner of *Juanita Canfield Enterprises*, sponsored the challenge with donations of fabric from her stash.
