Guild members were treated to a panel discussion about small groups. Panelists included:

- Nicki Lynch as moderator, Mini Minis
- Dottie Acton, SewWatt Quilters (5 members)
- Coralyn Colladay, Sewfistcated Ladies
- Barbara Kilby, Friends in Fabric (6 members)
- Margaret Natof, 3Ts (12 members)

All panelists emphasized the support that can be found in small group settings and after that common factor the diversity of the groups became apparent. Some groups meet during the day, others in the evening.

Meetings can be weekly, monthly or as member schedules allow. There are groups that travel to shows, shops and take classes together, some groups have a meal at each gathering, some just sit and sew.

Of the groups represented, one has been meeting about 18 months and the longest running group has been getting together for about 20 years.

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All panelists suggested some basic ground rules: Find other quilters with like interests. Hand quilting, miniatures, modern or ?

- May be try a project for each member to show as a group in the guild show
- the latest challenge is finding a new restaurant to try as a group

Quilt Show Update Dottie Acton and Connie Ross

It's hard to believe that our 2017 Quilt Show is less than three months away. I know that seems like a long time, but....

The most important part of the quilt show is your quilts. Give yourself the gift of time to work on your show quilts, guild challenge quilts, Bloomin' challenge quilts, service project challenge quilts and small group challenge quilts. We all finally have a good excuse to avoid housework for a while! Quilt registration forms are due at the March 6 meeting or earlier. Your quilts don't need to be complete by then, but should be far enough along for you to include pictures showing what the finished quilts will look like. The registrations are needed this early so we can get started on the show catalog, and so the Staging Chair, Gerda Sherwood, can decide which quilts will be hung in each bay so the show has a cohesive look. Remember that each quilt you enter, including challenge quilts, will need its own registration form and picture.

We have set up an online site for volunteer registrations. More information will be provided at the February guild meeting. We will also be taking in-person volunteer registration at the guild meetings. Look for signup sheets in the lobby.

Lunch and snacks are needed for the Quilt Show. Sign up to bring a slow cooker entree or baked goods at the FSQ Guild meeting Feb. 6.

It's time to start working on your hand-crafted items that will be submitted to the Silent Auction. The form has been updated and posted to its own page on the FSQ Website: http://www.friendshipstar.org/silent-auction-2/

Have you thought yet about selling those cute things you make at the FSQ Show Boutique? It is so great to get a little cash back – you get to buy more quilting things! There is a modest \$5 registration fee plus a 10% commission to the guild (90/10 split). You will also need to donate some time to staff the boutique during the show.
