President's Message Nicki Lynch

Happy New Year – 2017! I don't know about you, but I'm glad to see the year over. I'm also looking forward to our show at the end of April. Our show always showcases the wonderful work the Guild members have done over the past two years. I plan to go through my quilts and pull out those I feel are my best. I hope everyone will put at least one quilt or quilted item in the show. You are part of the Guild and the show is to celebrate EVERYONE in the Guild.

On that note I also encourage everyone to volunteer to do something for the show, either before, during, or after it. I've gotten to know many of the members when I was volunteering. Our biennial show should be a group effort, not just the work of a small group.

In the week after Christmas, my husband and I visited a place I'd heard about all my life, but didn't realize it was so close. We took the George Washington Parkway to Mount Vernon, a very pleasant drive to a very pleasant place.

Being off-season, as well as an overcast day, the crowd was not as large as I imagine it is in the summer months. The welcoming video had a good crowd and we weren't alone as we walked to the mansion overlooking the Potomac river.

The tour of the main house was a slow walk through the various rooms with a docent giving a speech in each which was very informative. We then walked the spacious grounds and down to Washington's tomb. Little did I know the best was yet to come.

After talking with the various docents and taking a spin through one (of many) gift shops, I noticed a small sign that indicated one could converse with Lady Washington. We entered a well appointed room with chairs on one end and a Martha Washington re-enactor on a small stage one the other.

She had a wonderful brocade dress and the hairstyle and cap of the period. She was reminiscing about life with "the General". I had a question, based on what I knew about the female role in that society. I said I did needlework and I asked about hers.

It may have been my imagination, but she seemed to light up and talked at length. She learned needlework from her mother, but said she wasn't as good as others and her eyesight was failing, but she still did some. She talked about the needlework and asked the women to do needlework to support our troops during the Revolutionary War. She also had several pieces to show us. She showed a dress for her granddaughter and a bell pull she was making for her daughter's new house. The bell pull had her mother's favorite saying in symbolic form – Always be as busy as a bee, happy as a cricket, and steady as a clock. Despite the centuries between us, I felt as if I was in one of my small quilt groups, listening to one of the members talk about her work. It was a time binding experience.

As we went though the museum part of Mount Vernon, I reflected on who George and Martha Washington were. They were real people who lived in extraordinary times and rose to the challenge with solid work ethics and humility. They set examples for a new country with no past to draw from. I wonder what they would think of our country today?

The program this month is on the small quilt groups in the Guild. I've asked several people to talk, but I'm hoping others will volunteer to tell us their experiences as well. I hope to see YOU there.



Service Projects Update

We all know that quilters are a generous bunch! Here's a great way you can use your time and talents to benefit those who would truly appreciate some extra warmth and comfort. Take part in the Service Projects Challenge for the 2017 FSQ Quilt Show. Make a quilt that will hang in the show and will then be donated to Fisher House at the Walter Reed National Military Medical Center in Bethesda, one of the guild charities for the show.

Our theme is "Anything Under the Sun...or Moon" so all we're requiring is that your quilt include, on the front of the quilt, one of the following:

some recognizable piece of fabric that evokes a "sky". It can be a sunny sky, a stormy sky, a snowy sky, a sky at night. This doesn't need to be a pictorial quilt, just one that contains a "sky"-colored fabric; or

any "star" pattern, using any fabric.

In your artist statement, include information about either the type of sky your fabric evokes OR what star pattern you used

The minimum size for the quilt is 36" x 36" and the maximum is twin-size, since Fisher House welcomes family members from babies to adults.

Register your quilt and drop it off on the regular quilt drop off day and we will take it from there. You won't receive

- Please turn in ticket stubs (and payment) for any tickets that you have sold. If you need more tickets, Karen Moss will be happy to supply them.
- If you will be at the Mancuso Show in Hampton (Feb 23-26) please volunteer to sell tickets or white glove for a few hours.

- Start thinking about what volunteer jobs you would like to do at the show in April. Anne Flaggs is leading the effort to coordinate the many volunteer efforts that are needed for the show.
- Bring in any notions, books, fabric, patterns, etc. for the raffle baskets. We have plenty of baskets, and now we need to fill them.
- Don't forget to sign up to sell all those goodies you have been making at the FSQ Show Boutique. The cost is a modest \$5 registration fee plus a 10% commission to the guild. You will

- also need to donate some time to staff the boutique during the show. See or contact Suma Glassman, Boutique Chair, for registration forms or if you have any questions.
- Do you have any UFOs that you can finish for our quilt show's Silent Auction? It's time to start working on one or two quilted items or creating something special for the Silent Auction. Think about a price...you keep 70%; Guild keeps 30%. Items will be collected at the same time quilts are turned in. A photograph (4x6) must accompany each item. Now is the time to work on quilts for the show – challenge quilts, big quilts, little quilts, and everything in between! April seems so far away, but quilt registration is right around the corner.

The Bloomin' Challenge started with FSQ's 2005 Quilt Show. It was the brainchild of Coralyn Colladay and Karen Walker, members of FSQ. Through the generosity of Karen's business, *Quilter's Confectionery*, she donated the fabric for this challenge. The fabric always had a floral aspect in the design, hence the name, *Bloomin' Challenge*. Karen donated the fabric for the annual show challenges through the 2012 quilt show after which, she retired. For the next two quilt shows, 2013 and 2015, Juanita Canfield, an FSQ member and owner of *Juanita Canfield Enterprises*, sponsored the challenge with donations of fabric from her stash.

The last challenge, "Bloomin Challenge IX – the Finale" was called so because there were no new sponsors available to continue into the next quilt show. Hating to see the end of this guild challenge, Karen Moss, an FSQ member, has volunteered to chair and donate the necessary fabric from her stash to continue the challenge tradition.
