President's Message Nicki Lynch

As I write this the 2017 FSQ Quilt Show is this coming weekend. Connie Ross and Dottie Acton are doing and have done an outstanding job of putting this show together, along with the rest of the Guild. I'm looking forward to the show.

One thing I do to make quilting more enjoyable is to listen to something while I work. I've discovered that when I ask other quilters what they listen to while they quilt, they usually answer, "Nothing." They seem surprised that I listen to anything. I can't imagine doing all that cutting, pressing, piecing, sewing, layering, quilting, binding, and sewing a label on without something to listen to.

One of my earliest "toys" was a portable record player that came with six 45s. I played them over and over, both the A and B sides. Among my favorites were songs I later learned (I hadn't leaned to read when I had the record player) were "Heartbreak Hotel" by Elvis Presley and "Dance of the Sugar Plum Fairy" by an orchestra. There usually was a radio or TV playing during the day, if my record player wasn't.

When I was in elementary school, I got a radio of my own – a transistor radio. It was small and a bit tinny, but it was mine and I could listen to any station I wanted. It was the beginning of a life long love of radio. When I was in college, I joined the radio station and continued my love of music and radio. I also found a terrific guy and married him.

Radio was my constant friend until CDs replaced records and the CD player became common. About the same time I discovered quilting and spent many hours listening to favorite CDs and sewing. One day in the library, I discovered audio books on tape. I'd always loved reading, so I checked out several out and listened to them while quilting. It's a wonderful way to spend the afternoon – quilting and listening to a book by a favorite author.

Like records, audio tapes gave way to books on CDs. But wait, there was an even newer technology for listening to books – loading an audio book on a MP3 player and listening to it on ear buds. I not only could listen to a book while sewing, I could listen to it while walking in the neighborhood or doing housework. I felt as if my world had expanded due to the e-book world the public library supported. Did I mention I have a love of libraries?

So, I'm happily quilting and listening to audio books, when another wave of innovation hit – podcasts. While podcasts have been around for about 10 years, I only recently became a faithful listener after hearing *The Big Listen* on NPR. Podcasts are radio shows you can listen to at anytime, using one of the many apps available for any electronic device. The variety of podcasts is endless.

So, next time you're quilting, try putting on your favorite music, or listen to an audio book or podcast. You just may find it makes quilting more enjoyable.

Can you believe that May is just around the corner? The May meeting will mark that last speaker of the year. Donna Radner will be our lecturer and will present her trunk show of quilts.

Color, pattern, and texture in fabric are Donna's starting points in designing quilts. She works intuitively, without preplanning, and lets the quilts take on a life of their own. Donna's techniques have developed over time, at first, primarily by piecing, using many different hand-dyed and commercial fabrics. Over time she added fused applique and heavy machine quilting for even more texture and complexity.

Donna has been captivated by the striations found in in nature. Her goal as an artist is to inspire you to feel what she feels when she looks at nature. Donna's recent work is a series of fused landscapes inspired by the ocean, the rocks and canyons in the western National Parks and the rocky coast of Maine. Her latest series reflects the strength and beauty of tree trunks as they survive over time. Take a look at her gallery at donnaradner.com.
