President, Barbara Kilby, called the meeting to order and welcomed visitors and new members. No changes to September meeting minutes were submitted and the document was approved.

Our Treasurer, Sabina Lindley, has requested that all treasury postal correspondence be sent to the official FSQ address. (Attn. Sabina Lindley, C/O FSQ PO Box 8051, Gaithersburg MD 20898) She is moving and does not want important documents to be misplaced.

Judy Walsh, Membership Chairperson, provided a dues reminder and provided membership statistics of 104 members with 15 having not paid their dues. She also reported that the Membership Directory was to be published in October and those whose dues were not paid, would not be included in the directory.

Nominations for Charities to receive the 2019 Quilt raffle proceeds were requested and once again Equipment Connections for Children was nominated, voted on, and unanimously approved.

2019 Quilt Show Co-Chairs Connie Ross and Teresa Peterson announced the next meeting as Nov 13th at 7 PM and will be located at Asbury Methodist Village, 400 Russell Ave., Gaithersburg, MD 20877. They also announced that all positions were filled with the exception of 2. (Advertisers for the catalog and Publicity/Media).

And as a reminder, Quilt Show dates are April 26-28, 2019 with set up on the 25th. We have a target of 300 Quilts for the show. In addition, quilted bags and quilted clothing will be accepted. They encouraged donations of specialty baskets from individuals or groups please contact Karen Slayton for more details. They also requested guild members to start collecting items that can be donated to raffle baskets. Also, members should look to items to sell at the Silent Auction. Lastly, they said encouraged members to make items for Boutique.

Bloomin Challenge Chairs, Meg Tison, JoAnne DuChez, and De Veda Powell announced that the details for the 2019 Bloomin Challenge would soon be available.

AQS Ultimate Guild Challenge Chairs Liz Lawrence, Jennifer Rossmere, and Mary Ann Bruce announced details required for FSQ Guild submission. The theme was to be Twinkling Stars and quilt dimensions are to be 35 to 40 inches by 55 to 65 inches. In order to for the guild to participate 8 quilts will need to be ready for submission by March 4th, 2019.

2019 Raffle Quilt updates included that Gerda Sherwood would act as raffle quilt scheduler Lorie Coston has created a sign up genius for ticket sales at Quilt Quest (Oct 19 thru 28), and that Karen Moss has member ticket packets available for pick up.

2020 Raffle Quilt Proposals will be considered/voted on at the Oct. 9th Executive Board Meeting.

Suma Glassman presented Service Project Committee Co-chairs Nancy Brennan (and Anne Weaver in absentia) with an Award from the Montgomery County Council in recognition of their dedicated, selfless, and exceptional work as Service Project Co-Chairs for the Friendship Star Quilters. Anne will be presented with her certificate at a later date.

JoAnne DuChez announced Suzi Parron as the featured speaker for the evening and her presentation of Barn Quilts and the American Quilt Trail Movement.

The Strip Tease Challenge winners were announced after the speaker's presentation by JoAnne DuChez. Colleen Biasco won in first place, Dottie Acton in second place, with Ellen Robinson in third place. Photos of the winners and submitted quilts will be available on the FSQ Facebook page.

After show and tell, door prizes were presented to Rosemary Hormuth, Gina Kitsoulis, and Jane Phillips. This was followed by Fat Quarter drawing. The 3 winners were Judy Newton, Ihsia Hu and Elizabeth Plantz. The meeting adjourned at 9:10 PM.
