

President's Message

My son Sean exaggerated when he said he had an "extra" Christmas tree, but he offered to bring it over, and I could hardly refuse. He hauled in a sealed cardboard box, obviously newly purchased, and unpacked a very skinny 8-foot artificial tree. It took us two hours to unwind the prewired white lights; Sean then snapped together the three sections of plastic greenery, groomed the branches, and decked it with 200 multicolored LED's. That took another two hours. The tree has a quilted table runner for a tree skirt, and the decorations include an assortment of county fair and quilt show ribbons I have collected since I joined FSQ as a beginning quilter. It stands in a corner of the dining room, and I have never enjoyed a tree more.

On the other side of the dining room stand two homemade design walls covered with all of the 2020 raffle quilt blocks. We distributed 71 kits and got back all but a few; the stars contain a wide variety of prints and batiks, and the next stage of making the quilt top is deciding how to distribute them. As of today, I think the darkest indigo values can go on the outside edges, so that there will be a pool of medium blue blocks near the center. It will still have a scrappy look no matter what we decide. We really appreciate all of you who made Ohio stars for this quilt. Once we have the top put together, we'll invite bids for the longarm quilting.

The raffle quilt is always our main fundraising project. It helps pay for the speakers at FSQ meetings, furnishes the supplies for Service Projects quilts, and provides an annual donation to a local charity; this year we are again supporting Equipment Connections for Children. Over the past 12 years our raffle quilts have raised more than \$16,000 for charity, and several times that for Friendship Star Quilters projects.

Meanwhile, we still need people to take the 2019 quilt "Oh My Stars!" out for visits to other groups to sell raffle tickets. It need not be a quilt guild; a book club or a bowling league may be a good venue. Our aim is to raise \$5,000 by April, and we have collected only \$2,000 so far. If you belong to another organization, we want your help in marketing this gorgeous creation. Contact Gerda Sherwood by phone, text message, or email if you are available to help. Even if you don't belong to another group, Gerda has a list of available dates and locations and can schedule a visit for you.

The next FSQ meeting, featuring a lecture by Morna Golletz, will be on Monday, January 7, 2019 at 7:30 pm. Wishing a very Happy and peaceful New Year to all of you!

Service Projects Update

Many FSQ members know that our guild has a very active community outreach effort involving quilts, preemie quilts and pillowcases. The question we get often is, "So, who gets these quilts?" This month we'd like to showcase one such group, **Healthy Families Montgomery**.

<u>Healthy Families Montgomery</u> (HFM) is one of the programs that come under the umbrella of the Gaithersburg-based Family Services, Inc. HFM provides a variety of home-based parent support services for first time parents in Montgomery County. It is a voluntary service for families who have been screened for multiple stressors such as mental health or substance abuse concerns, or the experience of abuse or neglect as a child, among other factors. Home-based services begin before the baby is born and continue for at least six months to three years, depending on the severity of the need.

Our baby quilts are given to each family in the program as part of the coaching to promote positive parent-child interaction. In addition, coaches provide information on child development, developmental screening, and access to various community services. Services can be provided in both English and Spanish.

Please join us, if you can, for our January Service Projects workshops, which will be held on Thursday, January 10, and Tuesday, January 15. We meet from 9:30 am until about noon at Fairhaven United Methodist Church, 12801 Darnestown Road (Route 28), about ½ mile west of Quince Orchard High School. The next meeting is January 15, 2019 at 7:00 PM at the usual Asbury meeting room. If we have nasty weather I will publish the call in number for a conference call instead.



Emails 101 Judy Walsh

We use a monitored broadcast list for FSQ-related emails. This means that only those who are subscribed to the list will receive "blast" emails sent through our listserv. And if you get a new email address, you need to change your profile in the listserv.

To send an email to everyone on the FSQ listserv, address your email to fsq@lists201d.his.com.

If you think you may not be receiving some emails, check to see how your email preferences are set up.

Open your internet browser and enter the following URL address:

https://lists201d.his.com/mailman/listinfo/fsq and press the Enter key.

- Scroll down the page until you see the "FSQ Subscribers" section, where you can view the list of subscribers, or change your subscription options.
- To view and/or change your email options, or to start using a new email address, enter your subscriber email address and click on "Unsubscribe or edit options".
- On the member options page, enter your password and click on Log In.
- Your subscription options are shown at the bottom of the next page. Review the options and select or update the choices according to your preferences. After you click on "Submit your options" you should see a message near the top of the page stating your options were successfully set.
- Digest emails are generally sent once a day. So be aware that if you choose to receive a digest, you may not be informed of an urgent item such as a special sale or an opening in the retreat quickly enough to take advantage of it.
- If you are changing to a new email address, you will receive a confirmation email at your new address that will require a response from you. If you do not reply to that email within 3 days, the change will not be made on the listserv. So be sure to also check the Spam folder at your new email address after making such a request.



Twinkling Stars is the Ultimate Guild Challenge

There are only about two months left (due at the March 4, 2019 FSQ meeting) for you to complete your Twinkling Stars quilt for the American Quilters Society (AQS) 2019 Ultimate Guild Challenge. We hope you have an idea for your *Twinkling Stars* quilt and how to interpret or represent the definition of "twinkle" as part of your quilt. Merriam-Webster defines the word twinkle as an 'intermittent radiance', 'a rapid flashing motion or to flutter rapidly' along with 'to shine with a sparkling light'. Another avenue to contemplate is the shape of stars which can be represented with points or even smooth and round - as the sun is a star!

The quilt is to have a width between 35" and 40" and a length between 55" and 65".

We have received some questions as to embellishments, painting, lighting. The AQS instructions include: Quilts must be able to stack with other quilts and boxed or rolled without possible damage to quilt. Therefore, minimal embellishment (small beads or other items) must be sewn down. Due to mailing and packaging, embellishments should be minimal in relief. Thread painting is acceptable. Quilts with electrical components or special lighting cannot be utilized due to fire safety. Also, quilts must be a single unit and may not be framed with wood, metal, etc. No rods may be sewn into a quilt.

When completing your FSQ registration form for submitting your quilt, please include a brief story about your quilt and how you interpreted the theme of "Twinkling Stars" (how you interpreted or represented the definition of "twinkle").

The finished quilts will be due at the <u>March 4, 2019 FSQ meeting</u>. We are hoping we will have at least 8 quilts so we can submit them to AQS.
