

## President's Message

In spite of all the snow and rain, this month's message starts off pretty dry:

The **Friendship Star Quilters Executive Board** meets every other month to decide on policies and overall plans for the guild, including programs and budgets. Meetings generally run about an hour or sometimes a little more. At the most recent meeting in February we acted on several important issues. I thought everybody should know about these decisions:

We confirmed the dates for our **2021 Quilt Show**. It's two years off, but several craft shows are competing for "our" weekends in April, so we needed to make our Fairgrounds reservation now. We agreed on April 29 through May 2, 2021, and will deposit 25% of the rent when we send in the signed contract.

We reviewed the **Raffle Quilt Marketing** schedule. Several Board members agreed to go to the Hampton Mid-Atlantic Quilt Festival. We hope the Oh My Stars! Quilt sells a lot of tickets at the show. Thanks to all of you who used **Signup Genius** to volunteer for White Glove duty and ticket selling, and to Gerda Sherwood and Carol Carrier, the mainstays of this four-day marketing marathon.

We approved a number of **FSQ Programs**, including the guest Speakers and other events at monthly FSQ meetings in August through December 2019. Cathy Miller is the new Program Chair and she'll supply details on the Website and in future issues of the Quiltline.

We agreed to a proposal by Anne Weaver to make a **\$500 donation to Fairhaven United Methodist Church**, where the Service Projects committee meets twice a month to make charity quilts. The church provides meeting space and storage for the fabric, batting, and supplies and has never charged us rent.

We approved a proposal by Judy Walsh, our Membership Chair, to recruit a few FSQ members to serve as **Hostesses**, making new members feel welcome at our monthly meetings.

That seems like a lot to accomplish in an hour, but the meetings are fun -- and actually not so dry after all. Voting members are the elected officers and chairs of standing committees, but all Friendship Star members are welcome to participate, to listen in, and to make suggestions.

If you are thinking of joining a committee - or running for office - or are just curious, please come to an Executive Board meeting. The next meeting is on Monday, April 8 at 7 pm at 400 Russell Avenue in Gaithersburg. Contact me for directions and details.

Hanging Sleeve must be attached as described on the AQS site, [www.quiltweek.com/contest](http://www.quiltweek.com/contest). Scroll down to “For requirements for your hanging sleeve”.

1. Label on bottom corner of quilt back. Quilt Title, Name, Address, in that order.

2. Permission copyright release if using someone else’s pattern.

Appraisal submission if quilt is over \$1000.

We will be taking photographs of each quilter with their quilt at the March 4<sup>th</sup> FSQ meeting. If you are not there, we will work something out.

## Quilt Show Volunteers: We Need You!!


Hopefully by now, you have heard we are having a quilt show, well we can't pull it off without the guild members volunteering during the show at the various stations to help sell tickets, give away fabric, white glove, etc.

We recommend that everyone does at least 2 shifts of 2 hours a piece to ensure we have full coverage at the show. Anyone doing at least 4 hours of work will be in the drawing for one of the volunteer raffle baskets that we will give away at the May meeting.

Sometime in February, all the jobs will be posted in Sign-up Genius so you can find the right slot and time that fits your needs but I wanted to give a quick outline of the jobs to help you decide where you might want to work.

- **Turn-in** – this will occur the Saturday before the show and lasts about 4 hours. Jobs include checking in quilts and sorting them into groups
- **Setup (Thursday)** – this is an active job and is the actual hanging of quilts and transforming the fairgrounds into a spectacular show. This is 4+ hours but we will accept help for shorter shifts.
- **Admissions** – mostly a sit-down station that can be busy especially when the show opens for the day. The first greeters to our show, money is taken for tickets & show pins, catalogs are distributed and wristbands placed on the visitors. Also oversees the children's activities.
- **Raffles**
- **Quilt** – a sit-down job selling tickets to our beautiful raffle quilt that will be displayed
- **Baskets** – a sit-down job selling tickets to our hourly basket drawings
- **Featherweight** – an active sit-down job selling tickets for our featherweight drawing and sewing preemie blankets
- **Silent Auction** – a sit-down job overseeing all the items up for auction and their sign-up sheets.
- **Fabric giveaway** – a sit-down job handing out free fabric to our attendees that find the station
- **Hospitality** – an active job helping out in our food area
- **Service Projects (Saturday only)**– an active sit-down job helping visitors tie charity quilts
- **White Gloving** – an active walking job and a good chance to see the show while you assist visitors by pointing out interesting facts on quilts
- **Security**– an active walking job
- **Take-down (Sunday)**– an active job helping to take down the quilts and return them to our members. This will take about 2 hours and starts about 10 minutes after our show ends on Sunday.

If your spouses or older kids want to work the show, that is fine also, we have a few that like to do security and help with setup/takedown. Kids that need Service hours for school can earn hours by volunteering. Most of the jobs are sitting down, except for White Gloving and Security. If you can only stand/walk

Hi, All,






## Yard Sale




