In August, since many members are on vacation we have QUILT-O instead of a speaker at our guild meeting. This quilt-themed "Bingo" is a great way to ease back into our monthly meetings and to socialize with friends we haven't seen in a while.

For the cost of \$2 and 2 fat quarters, everyone gets 2 QUILT-O cards. Additional cards are \$1 and 1 fat quarter each. The fabric everyone brings becomes the prizes and the money collected goes toward the M&Ms we use as markers and the extra church set up.

It's a lot of fun and there are many chances to win! Standard "Bingo" games of horizontal, vertical and diagonal will be played, as well as some interesting variations. Once "QUILT-O!" is called and the card is checked, the winner receives a stack of fat quarters.

In September we'll be treated to a presentation on Story Quilts by Dr. Angela Lanier:

While quilts were often created for practical or decorative purposes, many women have crafted story quilts to share their voices on religious, political, and personal topics. Dr. Lanier's presentation will focus on the anatomy of a story quilt and will highlight story quilts created by a diverse group of women, as well as quilts she has made

A self-taught quilter who fell in love with the craft as an adult, Angela developed a tendency toward improvisational quilting, preferring instinct instead of structured patterns. In 2012, she joined the Uhuru Quilters Guild, and has since made close to 100 quilts of varying sizes and styles.

Dr. Lanier has shared her work at trunk shows and exhibits in the Washington, DC area, including the Sandy Spring Museum in Sandy Spring, and Montpelier Mansion in Laurel.

During the pandemic, one of her works was included in the <u>Gone but Never Forgotten:</u>
<u>Remembering Those Lost to Police Brutality</u> exhibit at <u>The Textile Center</u> in Minneapolis, MN and at the National Underground Railroad Freedom Center in Cincinnati, OH.

In addition, Dr. Lanier has led several quilting-related presentations at Montgomery College, where she has worked as an instructional designer since 2014.



At our October meeting we will celebrate Friendship Star Quilters' 40th Anniversary! Their first public meeting was held in October of 1982.

We are planning a look back at some of our history along with a round-table discussion by several members of the guild. The celebration will include a parade of quilts from past challenges, Presidents' quilts and quilts members share from their own quilting journeys.

To help prolong the use of your cutting mat, turn it over and cut on the back side. It's almost like having a new mat!

If you're squaring up a bunch of blocks, move them around so you're not always cutting in the same place on your mat.

If your rotary blade isn't cutting quite as well as you'd like, take it out and turn it over. Since cuts are usually made at a slight angle it may cut better on the other side, extending its life a bit longer

The Maryland Register of July/August has a Capital Quilts coupon, 15% off total purchase till 8/31/22. Many Maryland and Delaware shops advertise in the Register, which comes out 6x a year. I picked up a bunch of copies of the Register at the Maryland Welcome Center located on 270 South, a mile or two after the PA border. And that Visitor Center is very nice with all sorts of pamphlets, maps and travel info and very nice rest rooms. I recently stopped in a few months ago even though this Center has been there for some years. I was driving and made the command decision to stop at the Center.

You can find the Maryland Register at www.TheMarylandRegister.com or check at other states Visitor Center or Rest Stops. I found the New Jersey Register available at a rest stop along 95.

The Maryland Quilt Guide in the MD Register lists our guild and also those in Carroll County. There are articles and recipes and assorted interesting information.
