<u>Lucinda Marshall</u> is an award winning poet and writer, as well as a quilter and an artist using mixed mediums. She will be sharing some of her poems about quilting and other subjects, including several that were recently published in *QuiltFolk* and *Uppercase* magazines. One of her quilts has also been published in *Curated Quilts*.

In addition to sharing her poetry, Lucinda will show some of her quilts and talk about her approach to improv quilting.

In December we can look forward to a Zoom lecture by **Emily Taylor** on Collage Quilting.

Emily is a self-taught artist, fabric designer and quilter. She has been a creative entrepreneur in the home decor and quilting industries for over 20 years. Emily has been featured on QVC for her wallpaper murals and has created over a dozen fabric collections.

Service Projects Update

As leaves turn brilliant colors and cooler weather sets in, Service Projects has been pleased to continue to deliver warmth and comfort to area babies and children this month.

44 quilts, including the gorgeous medallion challenge quilts, went to Comfort Cases (https://comfortcases.org/), a local organization with a nationwide network, which provides backpacks full of comfort care items (a quilt, new PJs, a stuffed animal, toiletries, a book, etc.) to youth entering the foster care system.

We also delivered 16 preemie blankets and 18 baby hats to Children's Hospital, for children receiving outpatient chemotherapy as well as others battling severe illness. This is part of a nationwide program sponsored by Ryan's Case for Smiles (https://caseforsmiles.org/).

Also, NEW this month! Preemie kits, complete with directions and all materials needed will be at the guild meeting on Monday, November 7! Stop by and check them out. We will also have kits for quilt tops and pillowcases. The Great Wisconsin Quilt Show Karen Kehl

This year I was able to attend the Great Wisconsin Quilt Show in Madison, Wisconsin. This show was started by Nancy Zieman (remember *Sewing with Nancy* on PBS) and PBS, as there was not a large quilt show in Wisconsin. My friends and my mother-in-law used to go to this show. It was the first show that one of my friends had a quilt juried into. This year, I decided to submit three quilts and see what happened.

The show is a bit old fashioned and sends letters of acceptance, instead of e-mails. I got a letter that my 100-day Transformation quilt was accepted. I had less than 2 weeks to get the sleeve on it and ship it so it would arrive in Madison on time. That quilt is huge (114 x 116 inches) so it took me nearly a week to get cleaned, and get the sleeve on.

I squished it into a packing box and happily sent my husband to post it 5 days before the deadline. On the way back, he picked up the mail, and there were acceptance letters for the other two quilts! I quickly called the organizer to let them know that the second shipment might be a day or two late. Then I called Capital Quilts to pick up the quilt they had on display that was accepted for the show.



Everything got there on time, and my husband and I decided to go to Madison to see the show (our sons live nearby, so it was a good excuse to visit). Ken Burns had his quilt collection on display, and it is glorious – dozens of antique quilts in exquisite condition.

I did not win any prizes, but I was happy that one of my quilts was selected to be at the entrance to the show. I also noticed that many of the quilts that did win awards were embellished. There were sequins, beads and crystals on many of the winning quilts.

I would recommend this show to anyone who is willing to travel. Madison in September is lovely, and there were many impressive quilts and vendors with innovative tools and fun fabrics.
