This interactive menorah wall hanging was machine pieced and quilted by Bonnie Schnaer Rosen of Overland Park, Kansas. The candle flames are attached with pieces of hook and loop fastener, 1 for each night of the Hanukkah celebration.

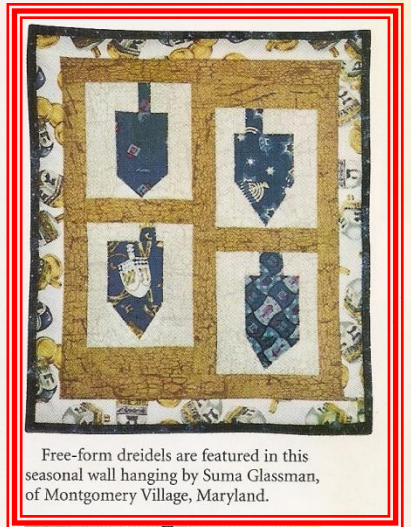

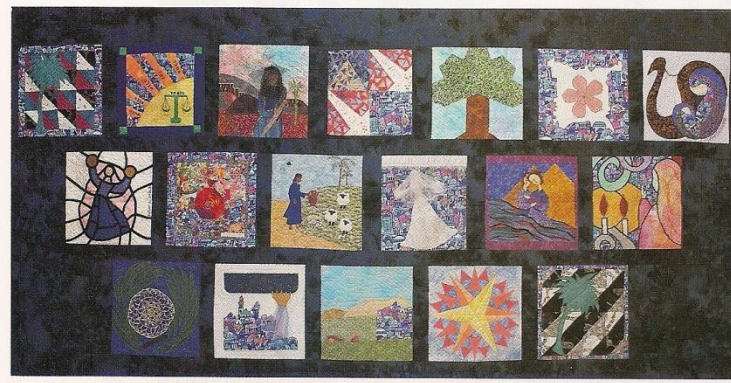

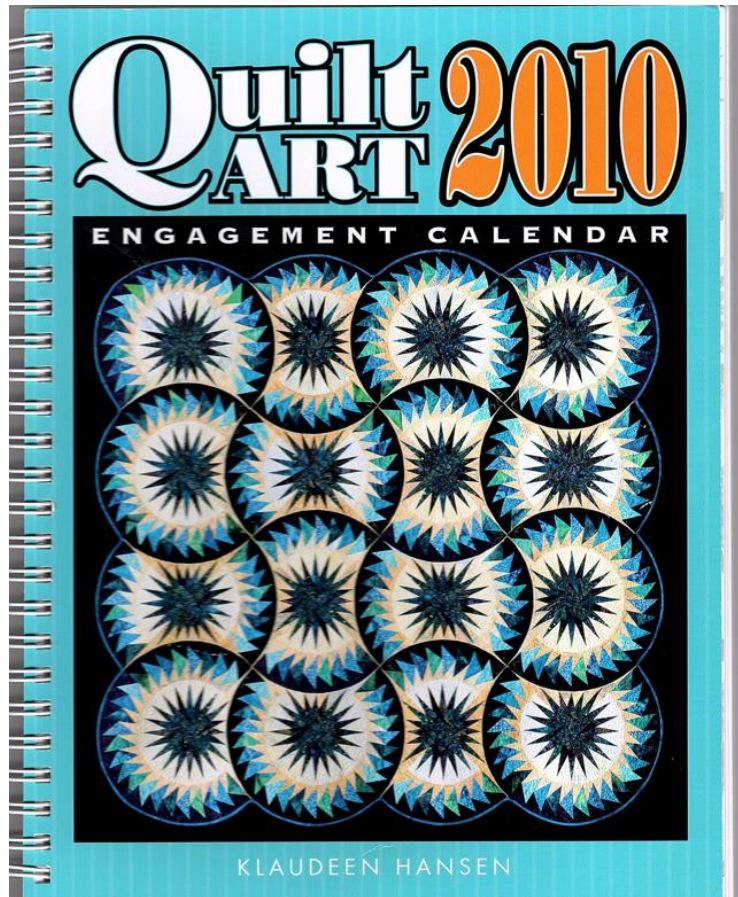
Free-form dreidels are featured in this seasonal wall hanging by Suma Glassman, of Montgomery Village, Maryland.

Historic Quilting Demonstration

Expert quilter Cecil Marzulli will show and discuss the technique of *broderie perse* on a cherry blossom themed quilt, hand-pieced in the 18th-century manner.

Broderie perse, French for “Persian embroidery,” is a modern term used to describe a historic appliqué technique. This technique can be found in extant quilts such as the Frances Washington Ball Peyton Quilt.

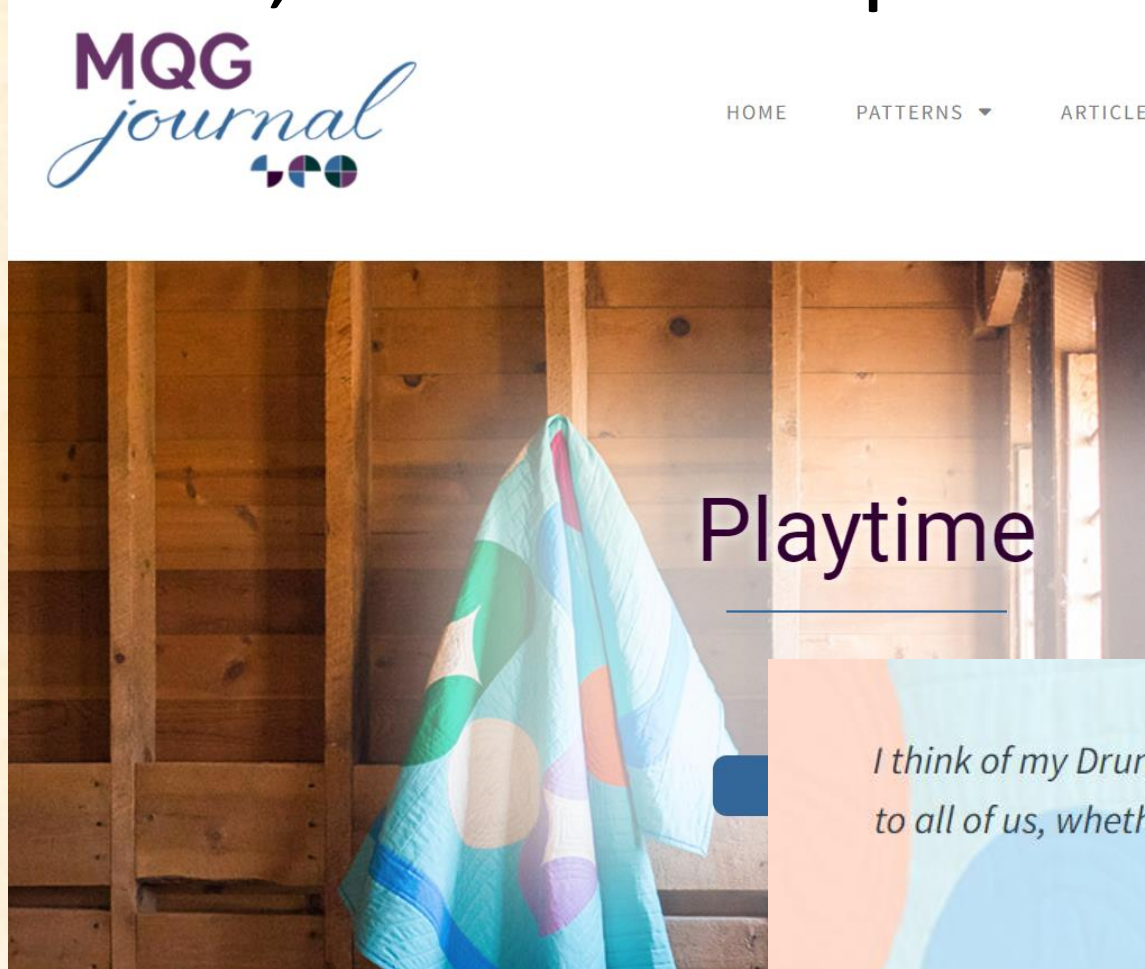
