Preparation for the show is in full swing. A meeting of the committee chairs was held on, January 18. The last committee chair meeting via Zoom, will be Wednesday, March 15 at 7:00 PM. All are welcome to attend.

The FSQ web site will be updated (hopefully by Feb. 1st) to facilitate registrations of your quilts and items for the Silent Auction and Boutique. A link to the Signup Genius for volunteers will also be on our web site along with job descriptions and expectations. All volunteers who work at the show will be eligible to win some beautiful baskets filled with brand new quilting fabric and quilting items donated by our hard-working quilt show committee chairs.

Note that March 12 will be the last day to register your quilts. Since you must submit a photo of your quilt at registration, you may want to refer to the following link before you take your photo:

Quilt Show RegistrationJudy Walsh

Our goal is to make sure that every member who wants to have a quilt in our show will be able to enter at least one quilt. We are allowing you to register up to 3 quilts, with the understanding that we may not be able to show them all. So be sure to mark your "most favorite quilt" with priority #1 on the registration form!

We are again using Google Forms to register our quilts. Google has changed their requirements since 2019, and because we are collecting photos with the form you must login to a Google account in order to register. It's easy to create a Google account if you don't already have one, or you could use a husband's or friend's account.

If not having access to a Google account will prevent you from registering a quilt, please contact me and I will work with you to find an alternate solution. My contact information is in our member directory.

You'll be able to find the quilt registration form on our FSQ website under the "Quilt Show – Quilt Registration" tab once the website has been updated.

While you may send in a photo of just the finished quilt <u>top</u> when you register, all registered items must be quilted, bound and labeled by Turn-in on April 19th.

Only queen- or king-sized quilts must have a hanging sleeve, but **all quilts must have an identifying label (maker's name and quilt title) securely attached to the back.** Pins are not sufficient.

Note that any quilt longer than about 90" will touch the floor. Before hanging, we will cover the floor with paper to keep your long quilts clean. That paper will remain there throughout the show.

After you have registered your quilt, you should receive an email confirmation with the information you have provided. The confirmation will be sent to the email address you provided at the beginning of the registration form. If you do not receive an email for each item within 2 days of registering, please contact me BEFORE re-entering the data! If a lot of quilts were registered on the same day it may take a while for Google to send the confirmations. Please also be sure to check your spam folder to see if it ended up there.

When you get your confirmation you'll be able to see your responses and can edit your form if you see a mistake.

Registration is expected to open February 1st.

The last date you may register a quilt is March 12th.



Quilt Show Boutique

Handicrafts include just about anything you make yourself... if you make it you can sell it! You set your own prices, FSQ gets only 10% and you help mind the shop during the show. Not a bad deal!

Registration for the Boutique will begin in early to mid-February. Look for the "Quilt Show" tab on the FSQ website to find the registration and inventory forms for your items

<u>Important Deadlines:</u>

Registration forms are due by Monday April 3, 2023. (FSQ Meeting date) Inventory forms are due by Tuesday April 18, 2023.

Sign up in Signup Genius to work at the booth by Wednesday April 19, 2023.

Deliver your contributions on Thursday April 20, 2023 between 3-6 PM (when quilts are turned in). Put on your crafty hat and get started!



Quilt Show Silent Auction

The Silent Auction is an opportunity for FSQ members to offer for sale items they have made. Items for the Silent Auction must be made by FSQ members. The maker sets the Opening (minimum) Bid, the Minimum Raise (by dollar amounts) and the Buy It Now amount. A 3½ x 5 color photo (digital or printed) is required for all Silent Auction items. The maker will receive 70% of the final bid and the Guild will retain 30%. All sales tax will be paid by the buyer. Registration forms will be available soon on the FSQ website.

We will accept registration forms at the March and April FSQ meetings. Deadline for registration is April 3. Delivery of Silent Auction Items is Quilt Turn-in Day Wednesday, April 19 between 3 & 6 pm at the Asbury Rosborough Building.

FSQ members can volunteer to work at the Silent Auction through Signup Genius.

Quilt Show Volunteers – We need you! Anne Flaggs

Hopefully by now, you have heard we are having a quilt show. Well, we can't pull it off without the guild members volunteering during the show at the various stations to help sell tickets, white glove and do other jobs. We recommend that everyone does at least 1 shift of 2.5 hours a piece to ensure we have full coverage at the show. Anyone doing at least 1 shift of work will be in the drawing for the volunteer raffle basket(s) that we will give away at the May meeting.

Sometime in February, all the jobs will be posted in Sign-up Genius so you can find the right slot and time that fits your needs but I wanted to give a quick outline of the jobs to help you decide where you might want to work.

- **Turn-in** this will occur the Wednesday before the show and lasts about 3 hours. Jobs include checking in quilts and sorting them into groups to ease the setup.
- **Setup (Thursday)** this is an active job and is the actual hanging of quilts and transforming the room into a spectacular show. This is 4+ hours but we will accept help for shorter shifts.
- Admissions mostly a sit-down station that can be busy especially when the show opens for the day. The first greeters to our show, money is taken for tickets, handouts are distributed and wristbands placed on the visitors. Also oversees the children's peek & seek activities.
- Raffles
 - Quilt a sit-down job selling tickets to our beautiful raffle quilt that will be displayed
 - Baskets a sit-down job selling tickets to our basket drawings
 - Featherweight an active sit-down job selling tickets for our featherweight drawing and sewing charity projects
- **Silent Auction** a sit-down job overseeing all the items up for auction and their sign-up sheets.
- Service Projects (TBD at this time) an active sit-down job helping visitors tie charity quilts
- White Gloving an active walking job and a good chance to see the show while you assist visitors by pointing out interesting facts on quilts
- Take-down (Sunday)

 an active job helping to take down the quilts and return them to our members. This will take about 2 hours and starts about 10 minutes after our show ends on Sunday.

If your spouses or older kids want to work the show, that is fine also, we have a few that like to help with setup/takedown. Kids that need Service hours for school can earn hours by volunteering. Most of the jobs are sitting down, except for White Gloving. If you can only stand/walk for 1 hour and would like to White Glove just let me know and we can work something out.

As an FYI, jobs for the Boutique will be coordinated thru Peggy Weidman, as typically these workers also are sellers in the boutique



Service Projects Update

The holidays and the FSQ retreat have come and gone and FSQ members have been very generously donating quilt tops, pillowcases and preemie quilts to Service Projects. We recently have delivered 71 quilts to Comfort Cases for children entering the foster care system nationwide, as well as 18 preemie quilts and 65 knitted or crocheted preemie hats to the NICU at Children's National Hospital. At the FSQ retreat, members completed a number of pillowcases and preemie quilts. Thank you!

We appreciate all of the beautiful work you give us which we always share at our workshops' Show & Tell. As a quick reminder, it's especially helpful when the quilt tops measure 39" or less in width so we can use a width of fabric for backing and don't need to piece the backs. That makes the process of finishing them up and delivering them to our community organizations so much quicker.
