Below is a great list of reasons to volunteer that guild member Ellen Robinson wrote up many quilt shows ago but it's still a great reminder of what it means to volunteer.

#### 10 Reasons to Volunteer at the Quilt Show

by Ellen Robinson

- 1. Volunteering gives you the opportunity get into the show for free ALL WEEKEND. (And you get to shop at the boutique lots of hand-crafted products made by your fellow guild members.)
- 2. It's fun to volunteer.
- 3. If you help to during set up on Thursday, you get a sneak peek at the quilts ahead of time. Up close and personal.
- 4. If you volunteer to white glove, you get to touch the quilts, with white gloves on! And you can get your daily 'steps' in.
- 5. If you sell raffle tickets (quilt, baskets or featherweight), your job is sitting down and you get to meet all sorts of new-to-you people.
- 6. If you volunteer at the admissions area, you get to greet every person that comes into the show on your shift.
- 7. If you volunteer at the silent auction, you get to see the articles being auctioned off up close and personal.
- 8. At service projects on Saturday, you have the opportunity to help show guests who want to make a difference.
- 9. At show tear down, you again get up-close and personal time with the quilts. (And quilt turn back is not delayed due to not enough volunteers to tear down.)
- 10. No matter where you volunteer, you get to meet other volunteers. When I was in the guild less than a year and really knew just 2 other people, I volunteered for two 2-hour shifts at admissions. I was amazed at how many guild members I got to meet that way. Many have become good friends of mine.

Please drop by our tables, page through a few books, and make a couple selections to take home for a month. We have lots to inspire you and get your creativity flowing.


If you have a particular book you would like to see added to the Library selections, please let us know. Suggestions are welcome.

# Weaving Workshop Report Ellen Robinson

A small group of FSQ members attended a Zoom workshop with Eleanor Levie on Saturday morning (1/28). It was a lively, interactive workshop, and Elly gave us coaching on our fabric selection, the mood of each piece, and provided advice to us on our add-ins (ribbons/trims, etc.), as well as the general instructions on constructing our woven pieces. Each resulting piece was unique and had its own personality.





#### SERVICE PROJECTS 2023 SUMMER QUILT CHALLENGE PREVIEW

Can you guess from the title what the summer challenge will be? If not, I'll provide a couple more hints.

- What had angles that add up to 180 degrees?
- What has 3 angles and 3 sides?
- What comes a variety of types?

If you guessed TRIANGLE, you are absolutely, positively correct! Use your imagination to tingle your triangles. Show us how you can do the triangle tango. Go ahead and try to square your hypotenuse. Whatever your (tri)angle is, just do it!

There are no boundaries on what your triangles must be, but your quilt must read "triangles". Any type is acceptable: right (or left), equilateral, isosceles, scalene, obtuse or acute. Check out Pinterest for examples of traditional and modern triangle quilts.

Fabric bundles will be available at the April and May meetings and at Service Project Workshops. If you'd rather, feel free to use your own stash for your creation. All quilts will be donated to Service Projects.

Quilt size may be 40" square to twin size. Quilts must be sandwiched, quilted and bound.

Finished quilts are due at the October meeting by 7:15 pm. Voting will take place before the meeting and during the first 5 minutes of the break.

Yard Sale Bucks will be awarded to the three quilts with the most votes.

We can't wait to see what your imaginative spirits create. Have fun and good luck!

Just found my information on the Miracle Ironing Board Cover. While at the Quilters' Unlimited Quilt Show at the Dulles Expo many years ago, I saw a demo on this cover and bought one, even though the price was high. Of course, it is now even higher. I reordered last year and am still satisfied with the cover.

"The cover is woven with Owens-Corning Fiberglass and guaranteed to never burn." Medium setting for heat is recommended. Cover can be washed or sponged off and is reversible.
