Quilt Show Volunteers – We still need you! Anne Flaggs

Hopefully by now, you have heard we are having a quilt show; well we can't pull it off without the guild members volunteering during the show at the various stations to help sell tickets, white glove and do other jobs. There are still some jobs and shifts available, mostly later in the day on Friday and Saturday and early on Sunday. Check out SignUpGenius and scroll through the list of jobs. Thanks to everyone who has already signed up, it's going to be a great show.

Here are a few notes/reminders about working at the show:

- You must sign-in at the volunteer sign-in table <u>daily</u> to get a badge and check off your name as working.
- Arrive 10-15 minutes before your shift on show days to allow for the check-in process and training on your job task.
- SignupGenius will send out a reminder 5 days before you are scheduled to work. You can
 also see the jobs you are signed up for in SignUpGenius on the "Invited To" tab if you login to
 SignupGenius using your SignUpGenius ID and password.
- We have been asked to register our cars with Asbury <u>daily</u> to ease the entry onto the grounds.
 This is a simple process and more information on this will be sent out soon.
- At present, all FSQ volunteers, vendors and Asbury associates are required to wear face
 masks. Asbury residents and other guests are encouraged to. If you forget yours, masks will
 be available at the volunteer sign-in table.
- There is not a hospitality area this year; we are allowed to bring bottled water into the main room but no food. Bottles of water will be available at the volunteer table and food can be eaten in either the library or outside. Breaks will be allowed, just arrange them with your tablemates or get a floater to sub for you while you are on break.
- Plan to leave your valuables in the car or keep them on your person or under your table as you are working.

SERVICE PROJECTS 2023 SUMMER QUILT CHALLENGE

Well, I'll tell you what the point is. The Service Projects Summer Quilt Challenge is starting to rev up.

If you recall from the last newsletter, the challenges is all about triangles. Use your imagination to tingle your triangles. Show us how you can do the triangle tango. Go ahead and try to square your hypotenuse. Whatever your (tri)angle is, just do it!

There are no boundaries on what your triangles must be, but your quilt must read "triangles". Any type is acceptable: right (or left), equilateral, isosceles, scalene, obtuse, acute. Check out Pinterest for examples of traditional and modern triangle quilts.

Fabric bundles will be available at the April and May meetings and at Service Project Workshops. If you'd rather, feel free to use your own stash for your creation. All quilts will be donated to Service Projects.

Quilt size may be 40" square to twin size. Quilts must be sandwiched, quilted and bound.

Finished quilts are due at the October meeting by 7:15 pm. Voting will take place before the meeting and during the first 5 minutes of the break.

Yard Sale Bucks will be awarded to the three quilts with the most votes.

We can't wait to see what your imaginative spirits create. Have fun and good luck!

Truth and Hope in Poolesville

We are most grateful for the donations of fabric, t-shirts, etc. from Friendship Star Quilters. I've been a member of Truth and Hope in Poolesville about 5 years. The group was started about 15 years ago for support, companionship and meaningful activity to provide items for those in need.

We meet at St. Peter's Episcopal Church the first and third Tuesday of the month and make and collect items which are distributed worldwide through missionaries and groups as well as local ministries. Items are distributed using donated suitcases, duffel bags, etc. which are also part of the gift to the recipients. Most of the items are taken as checked baggage by the groups so there are no additional shipping expenses.

Through donations from members of the community, churches, our local non-profit thrift store, and others - including Friendship Star - we have been able to bless hundreds of people. We make kit bags which we fill with health/hygiene items including soap, washcloth and hand towel, nail clippers, comb, toothbrush and paste, and school kits with paper, tablets, composition books, pens, pencils, colored pencils, eraser, sharpener, ruler and now a pencil case with the generous donation of fabric from FSQ. Our baby bundles include diapers made from t-shirts, baby gowns, bibs, hat, burp cloths, a cloth toy, Dove soap, 2 baby outfits, and a receiving blanket.

In the past 4 years we have made and distributed the following: 224 comforters/quilts/afghans, 877 kit bags/tote bags/shopping bags, 144 backpack bags/duffels/suitcases, 17 bags of small toys, 173 street packs (for homeless children in India, contains a fleece blanket and small toy in a cloth bag), 225 packages of baby/children/teen's clothing, 226 baby bundles, 29 pairs of eye glasses, 259 school kits, 287 health/hygiene kits, 111 pillowcases, 22 fleece blankets, and a few miscellaneous items.

I've often been asked where these items go. Here's a list from the past 4 years:

- Montgomery County, Frederick County and Virginia,
- Peru, India, Mexico, Kenya, Burundi, Honduras, Colombia, Dominican Republic., Nicaragua, Uganda, Cuba
- Middle East, Central America, and the Philippines.

Also world-wide through

- Operation Christmas Child,
- Samaritan's Purse.
- Living Word Bible Fellowship,
- Cumberland Valley Relief Center in Marion, PA.

Thank you again to all who have made donations.

This YouTube video does a neat job showing some of the different ways to create quilt blocks by strategically folding and sewing instead of cutting fabric.
