President's Message

Hello Quilters,

How did it get to be May?

First, I need to thank Trish McTighe, Judy Walsh, all the quilt show committee chairs and volunteers for a fabulous show! We may have been in a smaller venue, but we made a big impact. We will have some facts and figures about the Celebration of Quilts at our May meeting.

I want to take a few minutes to reflect on how being in the Friendship Star Quilt Guild has changed my life. When I first joined the guild, in January of 2017, I was relatively new to the area, and I realized that I wanted socialization outside of my work. I was hesitant to join a quilt guild because I didn't think my quilts were "good enough" for a guild. I don't think I shared a quilt in Show and Tell for more than a year. 2017 was a quilt show year, and I was stunned at the talent and dedication of the guild members. I was a little intimidated by the awesome quilts, but I was also encouraged by the kind words about my one entry. Shortly after the show, someone who volunteered at the admissions table at the same time as I did, asked if I wanted to be part of a new small group. I said yes, and I have never regretted that decision. My small group friends have encouraged me, and critiqued my work, pointing out where I might benefit from learning new techniques to make me a stronger quilter. Over the past 6 years, all of you in the guild have encouraged and supported me in ways that I never thought possible. I certainly would not be teaching quilting and designing quilts without my experiences with Friendship Star Quilt Guild.

Events like the quilt show, and experiences like those I have had are only possible due to the many volunteers who run the guild. We all enjoy coming together to see beautiful quilts, talk to old and new friends, and learn new techniques at our meetings. And we certainly enjoy events like the quilt show, and yard sale. Without volunteers to plan, organize, and run the meetings and events, the guild would not exist.

April Guild Meeting Minutes

Karen Kehl called the meeting to order at 7:30pm and invited Lisa from NeedleChasers forward. NeedleChasers reps are present tonight with their guild's raffle quilt, which is called "It's a Material World", contains fabrics from around the world and is 90" x 108". They are available in the lobby with their quilt on display and tickets available should anyone wish to purchase. The drawing will take place at their quilt show on October 6/7 at the Kensington Armory.

Meeting Minutes: The March FSQ Meeting Minutes were approved as submitted.

Committee Reports

Yard Sale – Carmen Contreras-Sesvold reminded everyone that donations continue to be welcome for the yard sale which will be in June. Items being accepted are fabric and batting (no clothing fabric please), UFO's, panels, notions and sewing machines (these should be in working order or able to be easily rehabbed, but Carmen will have each one serviced prior to the yard sale). She also noted that several bolts of fabric have been donated so there will be a cutting table added to the layout this year.

The Quiltline – May 2023

2023 Raffle Quilt – Jennifer Rossmere noted that tickets are still being sold so you can be in touch with her if you would like to purchase any additional or would like more to sell. The ticket for this quilt will be pulled at the yard sale in June.

2024 Raffle Quilt – Karen Kehl – as noted at our last meeting, we do not currently have a 2024 quilt in process so donations of a finished quilt top were solicited and one has now been chosen. Karen will be checking into getting the quilt long armed so will be investigating prices or the possibility of it being donated. Karen also invited anyone interested in being part of a committee to begin the process for the 2025 raffle quilt, please let her know. It's not too soon to get started!

Summer Challenge – Meg Tison – Meg and JoAnne DuChez were present with fabric selections in the lobby for anyone wishing to participate in the Summer Challenge. Your own fabric can be used, of course, but they have a wide selection available if you would prefer to pick up some. The challenge is to make triangles – in whatever way you wish to do this: large, small, any type of pattern. Quilt should measure 40" square up to twin sized, be quilted and bound and completed quilts are due at the October meeting. Quilts will then be donated to service projects for donations to local hospitals.

Quilt Show 2023

Trish McTighe reminded the group that we are just 2 ½ weeks away from our show. She thanked all those who have signed up to be volunteers so far but also indicated that several more are still needed. The link to sign up as a volunteer is provided on the FSQ website and also appears in this month's QuiltLine.

There are 108 quilts registered for the show and the drop off for these is on **April 19th, between 3 and 6pm**. Quilts are to be placed in plastic bags with handles (Judy Walsh has had these available for purchase these last two meetings) and the label for each quilt needs to be face up so that it can be easily read without opening the bag. Judy also had bags for mini quilts available tonight so if you still need one, contact her.

No food is allowed at the show, though there are seating areas outside and nearby restaurants should you wish to bring your own or buy something there. Water is allowed inside. Note that there is no place to secure any of your belongings so if you have a bag or purse that is not going to be on your person at all times, it is suggested it be left in your car – in the trunk so as not visible to passersby.

At this point, masks are required to be worn inside by all except for Asbury residents and their guests, so please remember to have a mask with you when you come.

It's not too late to continue spreading the word about the show, noting that children 16 and under are free and welcomed, and the cost is only \$7 for all others for all three days. Anne Weaver has extra flyers if you need them, but don't forget all aspects of social media, including Facebook and Next Door.

Silent Auction – Linda Belecki and Rosie Hormuth – when bringing your silent auction items to turn in, please make sure items are in plastic bags. If you still need to register your items, they have forms tonight, and they are also available on the website.

Boutique – Peggy Weidman – There are about 20 member who have registered items to date. If there are more items out there, Peggy asks that you get them registered ASAP (or contact her to let her know what you plan to register) so that she can be working on the set up logistics.

Additional Announcements

Board Meeting, 10 April, 7pm via Zoom – Karen reminded everyone of this upcoming meeting and that anyone interested is welcome to attend. Contact her if you'd like to receive the Zoom link.

Nominating Committee – we have one volunteer for our 3-person Nominating Committee so still need two more (current officers are not allowed to serve on this committee). The committee will be ascertaining interest from among the membership for the 2023/2024 officer positions of president, vice president and treasurer (to serve as co-treasurer with Trish McTighe). This all needs to be in place in order to vote at the June meeting, so please consider helping with the Nominating Committee – or going straight to volunteering for one of our officer positions!

Presentation – Quilt Judging

Michele Barnard introduced tonight's speaker, Deb Franklin. Deb is local and is a Certified Quilting Judge. Though she had a Power Point presentation prepared, the church's A/V system was unfortunately not cooperating. However, she soldiered on and provided us with plenty of insight as to what goes into judging a quilt. She became a judge herself to improve her own quilting so had helpful tips for all of us. Michele had brought by several of her own quilts for Deb to use in lieu of the Power Point as she described what judges look for.

Following a 10 minute break, the fabric raffle was held and five names were drawn: Nancy Debnam , Judy Newton, Kimberly Strong, Barb Morten and Liz Lawrence.

The door prize of notions was won by Barb Morten.

Show & Tell was held and consisted of one lovely small block of Michele's as part of a special project she's been working on (all else must be in the quilt show because no other show and tell was presented!)

The meeting was adjourned at 9pm.

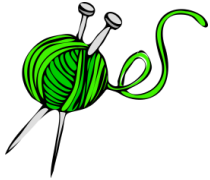
THANK YOU to the Quilt Show Committee Chairs and other volunteers who made this show run so smoothly!

SERVICE PROJECTS 2023 SUMMER QUILT CHALLENGE

I hope you have been thinking about the summer triangle quilt challenge. I've heard comments back about how many triangles need to be cut to create a quilt. Personally, I don't like to know how many pieces I'm cutting. My totals always seem to vary from one counting to another. However, I do really like all "a"cute triangles.

If you recall from the last couple newsletters, the challenge is all about triangles. Use your imagination to tingle your triangles. Show us how you can do the triangle tango. Go ahead and try to square your hypotenuse. Whatever your (tri)angle is, just do it!

There are no boundaries on what your triangles must be, but your quilt must read "triangles". Any type is acceptable: right (or left), equilateral, isosceles, scalene, obtuse, acute. Check out Pinterest for examples of traditional and modern triangle quilts.

Fabric bundles will be available at the May meeting and at Service Project Workshops. If you'd rather, feel free to use your own stash for your creation. All quilts will be donated to Service Projects.

The quilt size may be 40" square to twin size. Quilts must be sandwiched, quilted and bound.

Finished quilts are due at the October meeting by 7:15. Voting will take place before the meeting and during the first 5 minutes of the break.

Yard Sale Bucks will be awarded to the three quilts with the most votes.

We can't wait to see what your imaginative spirits create. Have fun and good luck!
