Service Projects Update



Quilter's Rainbow: The 2024-2025 FSQ Raffle Quilt



I have the honor of designing and coordinating the making of the 2024-2025 FSQ Raffle Quilt. The pattern, Quilter's Rainbow, is a sampler of classic quilt blocks in the seven colors of the rainbow. The difficulty of the blocks ranges from beginner (most of the blocks) to intermediate (there are two rows that require Y seams). There are NO curves. Each block repeats seven times (once for each color) and should measure 8 ½ inches when completed. The quilt will finish at 92 x 102 inches.

At the November FSQ meeting, I will have packets for each one of the 56 blocks. Each packet contains all the die cut pieces to make one quilt block, and an instructions page. I encourage everyone to consider checking out a block! Small groups may want to check out an entire row and work on them together. There may even be an opportunity to work on blocks during the February retreat.

Blocks need to be completed and returned by the March in-person FSQ meeting. After the blocks are collected, they will be assembled with black sashing and the borders will be added.

In April we will be accepting proposals for quilting. The quilt should be finished, bound, and labeled in time for the Montgomery County Fair in August. Then we will start taking it around to sell raffle tickets. As a bonus, we will also have copies of the quilt pattern for sale.

Please consider which block you want to make and come a few minutes early in November to check out your first choice– there is truly something for almost everyone.

AQS Ultimate Guild Challenge

Are you ready for a yummy new challenge?

Our theme will be **Food for Thought.** The challenge is to make a quilt inspired by a favorite food. This can be interpreted in a number of ways.

- Do the colors of citrus make you swoon? Make a quilt in bright yellow, lime, and orange!
- Aren't cupcakes the cutest things ever? Fill your quilt with cupcakes.
- Are you thinking about the source of your food? Picture your garden filled with ripe tomatoes.
- What will you come up with? Traditional, modern, pictorial ???

The possibilities are endless- but there are some rules.

- Shape: Quilts should be square or rectangular.
- Size: Quilts must be within 30 36 inches in width and 30 36 inches in length.
- Quilts must be labeled with the name of the quilt maker.
- Quilts must be finished to be considered for submission to AQS.
- All other AQS rules must be followed.

Timeline: I've estimated when AQS will want entries based on previous schedules, so the timeline *may* be adjusted based on the actual dates.

- September meeting: Challenge announced
- Mid-February 2024: I'll send out a poll to see if it's likely we will have enough quilts for an AQS submission.
- March 4, 2024: Finished quilts due at our regular March meeting.
- March 28, 2024: AQS entry due online

The Ultimate Guild Challenge: This challenge honors the results of a quilt guild's challenge to its members. The guild issues its own challenge to its members, choosing rules, fabrics, themes, or whatever! The top eight (8) quilts from the guild are submitted as one entry to The Ultimate Guild Challenge.

- One entry submission per guild (include theme, challenge description and rules, contact information, and guild group photo).
- Each individual can stitch or quilt on only one challenge quilt for one guild.
- Information (title of quilt and size) must be included for each of the eight (8) quilts, including full and detailed images of each quilt (see rule 6 in General Quilt Contest Rules).
- Each guild may submit quilts online at <u>americanquilter.com/quiltweek/event/homepage</u>.

A tip I just learned to finish your binding.

I recently discovered The Best of Sewing with Nancy Zieman on Create TV. She showed a much simpler way to connect the final ends of your binding.

- On the beginning of your binding strip, cut it at a 45 degree angle, press under a quarter inch and fuse a double sided tape to the seam allowance you pressed, leaving the paper tape in place.
- Start stitching the binding on about 3 to 4 inches from the prepared end.
- Stitch your binding all around, when you get close to the end simply place the raw end <u>into the</u> <u>open</u> beginning, remove the paper and fuse the 2 together. Then trim off the excess.
