### FSQ June 3, 2024 Meeting Minutes

The meeting started at 7:30 pm.

President Anne Flaggs welcomed everyone and a few guests identified themselves.

The April and May guild meeting minutes were accepted with no changes.

Anne Flaggs reviewed *The Quiltline* articles in case anyone present had not read the newsletter. Some highlights were

- Service Projects donations this year: 438 quilts / 177 preemie quilts / 233 preemie hats / 190 pillowcases / 77 placemats. We have a new partner for our donations Sheppard Pratt who provides mental health, special education, substance abuse, developmental disability and social services; domestic abuse shelter, affordable housing throughout Maryland. Service Projects happening in the summer on June 13, June 27, July 25 and August 1.
- Sip/Sew is canceled for the summer, resumes in the fall.
- An article by Judy Newton on Woven Histories exhibit at the National Gallery of Art now thru July 28. There were also some beautiful photos of vintage sewing machines for sale.

Anne mentioned that if you receive Junk emails from the FSQ president generic email to please delete them as she did not send them out.

Membership dues renewal is \$35 starting now thru September 2024.

The nominating committee chairs, JoAnne DuChez and Jennifer Rossmere, presented the current slate for election with Anne Flaggs, President; Michele Barnard, Vice President; Harriet Sheinson, Secretary and DeVeda Powell and Joy Dorman, Co-Treasurers. Anne presented gifts to committee chairs who served in the current year.

It contains more than 40 creative ideas for using everyday household items, as well as some sewing hacks for making some of our common jobs easier.



## What is it?

- A contemporary art quilt installation bound for Klev, Ukraine's main street in 2025.
- A powerful collaboration and statement of hand stitched art that flies in the face of a war-torn landscape.
- · A united force of quilters and artists from Australia, Europe, Ukraine, and the U.S.
- · All blocks from US quilters will be made into quilts at the end of the art project and will be donated to those in need through Wrap the World With Quilts.
- Wrap the World With Quilts is the organizer of the quilt blocks from the U.S.

## Why do it?

- To show the world that Ukrainians are brave and full of hope for peace as they try to survive the war and the cold and go about the hardships of their daily lives.
- To join with the many Ukrainians that are also stitching patches, making art as an act of caring, therapy, love, protest, and resilience.
- To continue OUR VISION of helping those in need through the comfort of a guilt.
