

You are welcome to use your own fabric stash, or you can pick up a kit (or two!) at any in-person FSQ meeting. We will be out in the foyer during registration and break with kits and directions, if you need them. Stop by and say hi!

Results of the FSQ Zoom Sip and Sew Survey

Out of more than 100 FSQ members only 25 responded. Of those 25, 9 respondents indicated that they were interested in Zoom Sip and Sew. 4 preferred to meet in the daytime and 5 in the evenings. The anticipated frequency of attendance was 6 occasionally, 2 occasionally to frequently, and one frequently. Based on these responses, it seems interest is really low and continuing with these sessions is not reasonable.

There were a couple of suggestions. One was to have everyone work on a small project together, such as an ornament, bag or service project quilt. The other was to solicit suggestions for a technique or item that people would like to learn more about. Ask members with expertise to volunteer to speak. Alternatively, do a bimonthly challenge based on topics.

I may send out another survey including these suggestions to see if they would significantly impact interest in Zoom sessions.



For those of you who enjoy foundation paper piecing, check out this <u>website</u> for a colorful free chart that will help you easily change the size of the blocks you want to create.

If you do reduce or enlarge your patterns, don't forget that your ¼" seam allowances will also be reduced or enlarged on the new pattern pieces, so be sure to trim them accurately when you cut them out.
