President's Message

Anne Flaggs

Hello Quilters, I hope you are all doing well and enjoying this change in seasons.

There is certainly a change in the winds in more ways than one. As a guild we have been meeting at the Church of the Nazarene on Warfield Road for a very long time. This year, the rental cost for our meetings has increased 60% and the board decided to look around for other potential meeting locations as our budget cannot sustain that significant of a rent increase for very long. We looked into the library, schools, community centers and Asbury as possible locations. Most of the locations were dismissed due to time limitations like being done by 9pm or not being able to rent for a year at a time. We also discovered that many of the locations will cost as much or more than our current space. Asbury has offered us a large space at no cost since we have several members who reside there. As part of a move to Asbury in March 2025, we will be changing our membership dues and guest fees slightly. I will present a recommendation at the October meeting, to be voted on at the November meeting, to reduce the membership fee for Asbury residents from \$35 to \$20 similar to our out of state members and to eliminate the guest fee of \$5. The elimination of the guest fees will allow any non-member Asbury residents and others to visit the guild for a monthly meeting at no cost.

To recap, we will be having our last meeting at the church in November 2024, then three Zoom only meetings in December, January & February, and then moving our meeting to an Asbury auditorium or classroom in March 2025. I know change can be difficult but there are many positives to this change and more information about exact locations will be shared as we get closer to our first meeting there.

Just a few reminders for our upcoming meeting:

- Get those Log Jam Quilts finished. I can't wait to see all of them, it's always an amazing site. And if you didn't quite get it done in time for the meeting, Service Projects will gladly take them whenever you get it completed.
- Consider signing up to chair a committee and help make our Quilt Show a success. We will also be asking for volunteers to help at the show starting in February.
- Check out the lobby before the meeting and pick up raffle tickets for our current quilt or drop off your stubs and money.

Nancy Brennan, Service Projects co-chair, mentioned Ryan's Cases for Smiles and that service projects kits are available for pickup.

Colleen Biasco, Retreat co-chair, reported that the Retreat at Bon Secours is February 14-17, 2025 has only one space available. Please see her if you are interested in going.

Rosie Hormuth, co-chair of the Library, reported that the size of the library has shrunk and asked if anyone wanted to suggest books for the Library to buy or buy a book, that those possibilities now exist.

Meg Tyson, co-chair of Log Jam Quilt Challenge reported that those quilts are due for the October meeting.

Lynn Stieber, membership co-chair reminded everyone that dues are \$35 and due now.

Judy Hoffman, Raffle Quilt Marketer, reported that last year the quilt brought in \$670 when it was taken to different guilds. She asked for help in getting this year's quilt out to other Maryland Quilt Guilds.

Michelle Barnard is coordinating blocks to make into a quilt for our president when she leaves office. It's going to be two blue ½ squares with a white strip in between the triangles and the sewer writes on the white part with her name and message. She will send out directions.

Sip & Sew chair Peggy Weidman spoke about the disappointing results of her survey. Half the group who responded wanted to do it during the day; the other half wanted to do it at night. Since the result was not very good, the idea was tabled for this year. She is going to send out another survey and asked that everyone respond.

Outside in the lobby, Nimble Fingers was selling tickets to their upcoming Quilt Bingo.

Stacy Ross, Programs co-chair, presented Pat & Arlan Christ's "Pennsylvania Dutch Quilts – Folklore and Superstitions". The program was very informative and enjoyable.

The meeting took a break at 9:15pm for 7 minutes.

Show & Tell was wonderful as usual.

Fabric Raffle bags were won by Cathy Miller, Judy Newton, Ellen Robinson and Ihsia Hu

The door prizes were won by Laura Markus, Liz Lawrence and Tomo Beckman.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:50pm.

The Quilt Show committee chairs met on September 23 to kick off our “2025 Celebration of Quilts”. Thanks to all who volunteered to give a great start to our show. The discussions ranged from ways the show will be larger in size to how to draw a larger crowd. We will be using all the corridors surrounding the Asbury Community Room and the Theater. The Yard Sale will be running for three days! Quilt Challenges and Demos have been added along with a Scavenger Hunt to include adults and children. We have **two** vendors but if you know someone or some organization who might be interested in vending, please send us the contact information. Vendors do not have to be sewing and quilting related.

SOME THINGS ALL FSQ MEMBERS CAN DO TO SUPPORT THE SHOW:

- If you haven't already, please start now on your quilts for the show. We're looking for about 150 plus quilts. Quilted items such as clothing, wall hangings, table runners or bags are also eligible.
- Think about and begin making items for the **Boutique**. These can be any quality craft items. In the past, pottery, jewelry, note cards and cat toys have been popular, as well as placemats, bowl cozies, table runners and other quilted items. **NEW: Makers receive 80% of the after-tax sales and the guild receives 20%.**
- Start to identify and make things that can be sold at the **Silent Auction**. This is another fundraising effort for our guild. 70% of the after-tax sales price goes to the maker, and 30% to the guild.
- Encourage your friends or small group to create a Raffle Basket for the Quilt Show and / or donate items for the basket.
- Finally, start gathering items for the **Yard Sale** which will be held all three days.

There are some chair positions still open – **Demos, Hospitality, Publicity, Outside Signs, Vendors, Viewer’s Choice.**

Please consider covering one of them as your co-chairs already have enough to do.

“Life’s a Beach!”



Quilters, now that the FSQ Log Jam Challenge is wrapping up, it's time to switch gears and start looking toward our quilt show next spring! For those who might be new to our quilt show, the guild invites its members to create a quilt under a specific theme. The completed quilts will be on display together at the quilt show in April and will be eligible for Viewer's Choice awards in the "Guild Challenge" category.

Our theme for the April 2025 show is **“Life’s a Beach!”** This fun category will keep sunshine in our hearts as we sew through the winter months. You can interpret the theme however you like, but here are some ideas to get you brainstorming!

- Use the palette of the beach and ocean to inspire your quilt's color scheme
- Pull out some of your favorite beach-themed fabric – lighthouses, surf boards, flip flops, crabs, fish, waves, seashells, etc.
- Borrow inspiration from colorful beach balls, umbrellas, beach towels, and boardwalk attractions
- Create something inspired by your favorite shore birds or marine life
- Sail away on a boat-themed quilt
- Recreate a favorite beachy photo in a collage quilt

The possibilities are endless!

To keep a unified look to our challenge quilt display, we ask that you keep the size of the quilt between **20-25” inches on each side** (in honor of our 2025 quilt show!). Tips & Tricks

Ellen Robinson

Recently, I received an email from a quilt designer that had a link to non-quilting things that can be used as sewing "accessories". I thought that it is pretty good, although I would never use electrical tape on my machine:

And I could add to it:

- Plastic, lidded deli containers to stash dull needles, bent pins and dull rotary blades.
- Wrap smaller quilts around pool noodles to prevent wrinkles (and wrap with the design "outward".)
- Ziploc sandwich bags to "corral" smaller pieces, even if your project is in a project box.
- Silicone cupcake forms: collect bits of threads as you sew.
- Chopstick, slightly pointed via a pencil sharpener, used as a stiletto and for turning out corners on a bag. One end is blunt, the other is slightly pointed.
- "Multi-tier rotating utensil holder from Pampered Chef" is wonderful for holding A LOT of tools within reach of your machine or ironing board without taking up a lot of space. You can find them used on Ebay, too. (google the words in quotes to find new and used ones).
- If you have a table dedicated to rotary cutting, raise it up with bed risers. Your back will thank you.
- Post its are wonderful for marking the non-standard seam allowance on your machine bed.
