Service Projects Update

FSQ's business year has just ended and we have some **GREAT NEWS** from Service Projects! Thanks to your generosity, once again we have donated record numbers of quilts and pillowcases to members of our community who are in need of a little warmth and comfort.

Here are our final numbers from June 1, 2024 to May 31, 2025.

432 babies', children's and teens' quilts
168 preemie quilts
383 crocheted and knitted preemie and children's hats
350 pillowcases
68 placemats

Our most recent donation was to Comfort Cases, which provides backpacks for children entering foster care. Each backpack includes a quilt or blanket, new PJs, toiletries and books. Fortunately, Rob Scheer, the founder of Comfort Cases, was in the office that day. We were excited to be able to get a picture with him.

THE DISAPPEARING BLOCK

SERVICE PROJECTS' 2025 SUMMER QUILT CHALLENGE

What do quilters do? They cut up fabric and sew the pieces together into blocks. This challenge adds one more dimension to that approach. Now you take that finished traditional block, slice it up, mix up the pieces and sew them back together in a different orientation. These new blocks may look much more intricate and nothing like the original block. You will be making your blocks disappear and become some other block. Is this confusing, or what?

The most common traditional blocks used for disappearing blocks are the 9- or 4 patch blocks. But many other blocks, such as pinwheels, windmills, hourglass, churns, may be used. Take a look on the Web or Pinterest and search for disappearing quilt blocks. You will be amazed! There are many tutorials that will walk you through how to make your block disappear.

Take the challenge and use up a lot of scraps or stash. You will be helping FSQ support our Service Projects mission to provide quilts to hospitals, Comfort Cases, Project Linus, A Wider Circle and other worthwhile organizations.

Also, please make an additional original block to display with your final quilt. It will be fun to figure out how you made that block disappear. Those additional blocks will also be donated to service projects for creating new quilts or kits.

Fabric bundles will be available at the May meeting. You may also select fabric bundles at the Service Projects Workshops beginning in April. If you'd rather, feel free to use fabric from your own stash.

The quilt size may be 40" square to twin size. Quilts must be sandwiched, quilted and bound. All challenge quilts will be donated to Service Projects for distribution.

Finished quilts are due at the October meeting by 7:15 pm. Voting will take place before the meeting and during the first 5 minutes of the break. Yard Sale Bucks will be awarded to the three quilts with the most votes.

We can't wait to see what your imaginative spirits create. Have fun!

What happens to all the Yard Sale leftovers?

During the 18 hours the sale was open, we sold

- over 800 pounds of fabric
- over 280 patterns
- over 55 rulers
- over 70 stencils and
- over 30 quart & gallon size bargain bags!

While that is a lot of fabric, patterns, notions and books, there are still a lot of leftover items. We are working hard to thoughtfully distribute the leftover fabric, patterns, books and notions. Below is the current list of where items will be donated:

+ SCRAP Creative Reuse/Baltimore, MD

A team of creative reuse professionals work to divert usable items from the waste stream and make creative materials accessible to teachers, parents, kids, hobbyists, artisans, and creative entrepreneurs. SCRAP will take our many patterns, panels and books.

+ Cathy Miller for her many Charity Outreach Groups

At the end of the sale, we asked Cathy to fill some boxes with fabric for her various groups. The fabric will make at least 40 reversible dresses, quilt squares for Truth & Hope and kits for Days for Girls. The outreach groups also use flannel for baby gowns, soft fabric for receiving blankets and make pencil bags for Christmas Child Shoeboxes.

+ Montgomery County Public Schools

A teacher at Wood Middle School will receive fabric for students who are making pillowcases for the Children's Inn at NIH, mastectomy heart-shaped pillows for Montgomery General Hospital and Little Dresses for Africa. The students earn SSL (Student Service Learning) hours for their time. We also donated fabric to a teacher who was at the show.
