- \* How is your Summer Disappearing Block Challenge coming along? It's due in October so if you haven't started it yet, now is the time to begin creating.
- \* Be sure to pick up this year's quilt raffle tickets in the lobby before the meeting. Our 2026 Raffle quilt will be displayed, and tickets are ready to be sold. This is our only fundraiser for the guild this year.
- \* We need some help running the Hybrid meeting each month. Peggy needs assistance monitoring the Zoom chat for comments and highlighting all the quilts that get displayed. We have 6 Hybrid meetings each year, 3 Zoom only meetings and 2 meetings that are in person only (*Quilt-O* & Pot Luck). Please consider helping out and keeping our folks at home connected to the guild.
- \* We are still in the planning phases for some items, but we hope to have a Sew-In to work on our 2027 raffle quilt in November and another Sew-In at the end of April to work on your own projects. Since we had so much fun at the Quilt Show, we are planning to have an event over the last weekend in April at Asbury for guild members to get together to sew and socialize. There is still

planning to be done to make this a success so let me know if you are interested in joining the committee.

## **Service Projects Update**Nance Brennan and Anne Weaver

Last month we gave a quick overview of sizes and donation locations for quilts and quilt tops, which you so generously make. Check it out if you missed it! This month, we are updating you on information about preemie quilts.

Preemie quilts are small quilts which we donate to local hospital NICUs (neonatal intensive care units). They're used to drape over the isolettes of premature babies and are given to the families as mementos of their stay. They are very grateful to get such a thoughtful gift during an extremely stressful time. Preemies are somewhat different from regular quilts. They are smaller, in the range of 30" – 33" square or rectangular. In addition, the top can be a cheery cotton, flannel or fleece and the back is flannel or fleece. They don't contain batting and are not bound. Rather, we make them envelope-style by stitching the layers, right sides together, with a ½" seam and an opening on one side so that the quilt can be turned. The opening can be closed by whip-stitching or just topstitched all around. Adding some light machine quilting, like a simple X, keeps the layers together. They cannot be tied. If you have one, please add one of the Service Projects labels to the back. You can also find directions on the Service Projects page of the FSQ website by clicking a button on the bottom of the page. We have preemie quilt kits available to the in-person guild meetings, which include all the components, including a label. They are a great, quick project and the families are very appreciative of them. Stop by and pick one up at the next meeting!

Please also join us, if you can, for our September Service Projects workshops on Thursdays, September 18 and 25. We meet from 9:30 am until noon at Fairhaven United Methodist Church, 12801 Darnestown Road (Route 28), a mile from Quince Orchard High School.

I still need to sandwich, quilt, bind and label my challenge quilt. Turn in will be at the October meeting. We can hardly wait to see your beautiful quilts.

One member asked if the quilt should have a label. Yes, Yes, Yes. We always put a FSQ Service Projects label on every quilt. If would be extremely helpful if you would attach a label. Otherwise, someone on the Service Projects committee will need to sew on the labels. I sorry to admit that I was remiss in stating this in the guidelines. My apologies. We will have labels at the September meeting. Please come to the Service Projects display and pick up a label. The label should be attached to the back of the lower right corner of the quilt.

We urge you all to continue to participate in the challenges. You will be helping FSQ support our Service Projects mission to provide quilts to hospitals, Comfort Cases, Project Linus, A Wider Circle and other worthwhile organizations.

Also, please make an additional original block to display with your final quilt. It will be fun to figure out how you made that block disappear. Those additional blocks will also be donated to service projects for creating new quilts or kits.

The quilt size may be 40" square to twin size. Quilts must be sandwiched, quilted and bound. All challenge quilts will be donated to Service Projects for distribution.

Finished quilts are due at the October meeting by 7:15 pm. Voting will take place before the meeting and during the first 5 minutes of the break. Yard Sale Bucks will be awarded to the three quilts with the most votes.

We can't wait to see what your imaginative spirits create. Have fun!



The raffle drawing will take place on June 1, 2026, at the Guild meeting. A portion of the profits will go to our chosen charities, Comfort Cases and Manna Food Center. Just a reminder -- in addition to selling raffle tickets when we take the raffle quilt to other guilds or venues, we ask each member to either sell or purchase 15 tickets. Although participation in the raffle quilt ticket sales is voluntary, this is a major source of funding for the Guild, and your support is appreciated. Tickets are \$2 per ticket or 3 tickets for \$5. If you buy all your own tickets, it's only \$25.
