Guild Meeting Minutes – Oct. 6, 2025Jennifer Rossmere

7:30 pm the meeting was called to order by Anne Flaggs. There was one guest, Linda, who was welcomed. Two new members, Jenn and Kathy were also welcomed. An amendment was made to the September meeting minutes to change Fairland United Methodist Church to Fairhaven United Methodist Church. The minutes were accepted as amended. Anne reviewed highlights from the Quiltline, including:

- *Raffle Quilt 2026 Karen Moss has raffle tickets available. Please take advantage of the 15% coupon to Capital Quilts on the back of the tickets.
- *Service Project dates are Thursday, October 9th & 16th at Fairhaven United Methodist Church in Darnestown from 9:30am to noon. They always have a wonderful show & tell and everyone has a great time working and socializing. Kits can be picked up at the back of the meeting room. Nice article about our current deliveries of quilts, preemie quilts and knitted hats.
- *Retreat full but we have a waitlist, see Jennifer for any questions.
- *The Program for November will be a presentation on Service Projects with special guests.

Committee Reports/Announcements

Treasurer -- Judy Walsh reviewed the Budget for 25 – 26. It shows \$21,000 in income with the major items being dues and the Raffle Quilt (not including the income for the Retreat which, with the Retreat expenses, nets to zero). Judy suggested that a donation can be made to FSQ if members don't want to participate in the raffle. The expenses are proposed at \$24,000 with the main expenses being Programs, Service Projects and \$1,000 which includes donations to Fairhaven United Methodist Church for the use of their space for Service Projects, and our two charities for this budget year; Manna and Comfort Cases. Although the budget shows a net loss, the very successful yard sale last year can cover the deficit. If anyone wants a copy of the budget, please get in touch with Judy.

Raffle Quilt Marketing – Maryjean Spencer is looking for volunteers to help her with the Raffle Quilt Marketing. She will also be looking for volunteers to take the raffle quilt to various guild meetings.

The 2026 FSQ Raffle Quilt, *Jubilation*, is completed! This beautiful quilt (100" x 100") is a design by Deb Tucker and pieced by Joy Dorman, who graciously donated it to the Guild for our raffle. It was long-arm quilted by Karen Moss and the handwork was completed by Anne Weaver!

The raffle drawing will take place on June 1, 2026, at the Guild meeting. A portion of the profits will go to our chosen charities, Comfort Cases and Manna Food Center. Just a reminder -- in addition to selling raffle tickets when we take the raffle quilt to other guilds or venues, we ask each member to either sell or purchase 15 tickets. Although participation in the raffle quilt ticket sales is voluntary, this is a major source of funding for the Guild, and your support is appreciated. Tickets are \$2 per ticket or 3 tickets for \$5. If you buy all your own tickets, it's only \$25. There will be packets of tickets, instructions and a picture of the quilt for all members at the next meeting. Please stop and pick yours up to get started with ticket sales. Ticket stubs and money are to be returned to Karen at a guild event or other arranged drop-off. If you would like additional tickets, those are available as well. * Patterns for: tops, shi	rts, dresses	, pants, pj's, hat	ts (beginner to	advanced)


- * Seam rippers
