We're happy to welcome in a new year and can't wait to see everyone at our January Service Projects workshops on January 22 and 29 at Fairhaven United Methodist Church.

We're excited to introduce a new partner, JSSA (Jewish Social Services Agency) to our list of donations. JSSA has taken over the contracts for several programs that were formerly managed by Shepard Pratt, including the Betty Ann Krahne Domestic Violence Center and the Family Discovery Center, among others. On December 18, we delivered 20 pillowcases, 22 preemie quilts, 1 adult quilt and 4 knitted children's hats to them, just in time for the holidays.



FSQ Workshops for 2027 Raffle Quilt

2027 Raffle Quilt Chairs

Happy Holidays and Happy New Year! We are getting started on our 2027 raffle quilt! We think it's going to be a beaut! We are very excited about the prospect of many members being able to participate.

In January, after the holiday rush is over, we will be holding two Sit'n'Sews for the purpose of making the quilt blocks that will go into our 2027 raffle quilt. Due to electrical limitations seats and irons will be limited, so we will be sending out a Signup Genius email in early January requesting members to sign up.

Details: Workshops will be scheduled on January 24 and 31 (both are Saturdays) from 10:30 to 2:30. They will be held at the Asbury 'clubhouse' building, which is also referred to as 'building 400.' It is off of Russell Ave. The blocks will be made using the foundation paper pieced (FPP) technique. We will send a list of supplies to each signup, but here is a preview:

- * Sewing machine with a new needle and an extra needle. (power cord and foot pedal, too)
- * White thread and white bobbin (all cotton preferred, otherwise cotton/poly blend)
- * Scissors (thread snips)
- * Cutting mat, ruler (one side should be 12 or 12.5") and rotary cutter
- * Pins ("flower head" ones will help)
- * Seam ripper
- * Paper/cloth bag at your table for scraps
- * Task lamp in case your seat needs more light
- * Seat cushion if chairs are not at a good height for sitting and sewing
- * Lunch (FSQ will provide bottles of water)

The 2026 FSQ Opportunity Quilt, ***Jubilation***, is ready to go! This beautiful quilt (100" x 100") is a design by Deb Tucker and pieced by Joy Dorman, who graciously donated it to the Guild for our raffle. It was long-arm quilted by Karen Moss and the handwork was completed by Anne Weaver!

The drawing will take place at our June 1, 2026 Guild meeting. A portion of the profits will go to our chosen charities, Comfort Cases and Manna Food Center.

In addition to selling tickets when we take the opportunity quilt to other guilds or venues, we ask each member to either sell or purchase 15 tickets. Although participation in ticket sales is voluntary, this is a major source of funding for the Guild, and your support is appreciated. Tickets are \$2 per ticket or 3 tickets for \$5. If you buy all your own tickets, it's only \$25.

Ticket stubs and money are to be returned to Karen at a guild event or other arranged drop-off. If you don't yet have your tickets or you would like additional tickets, those are all available from Karen.



I was browsing through the latest Membership directory and realized that we have members from 11 different states and the District of Columbia!

The State Fairs: Growing American Craft exhibit at the *Renwick Gallery* (Pennsylvania Avenue at 17th Street, NW, Washington, DC 20006) includes over 15 quilts and is so large that it spans both floors of the building. The free exhibit lasts until September 7, 2026, and is a short walk from the Red Line Farragut North Station. I spent 3 hours going through the exhibit and would go again if you want a buddy,

The exhibits feature many state fair classics such as a cow made of butter, a pyramid of preserves, hand carved leather saddles, and our favorites, the quilts. No two quilts are the same. One is made completely from fair ribbons, one made of buttons, another of yarn, and of course there is a 4H one. Two quilts stood out for me. First, a crazy quilt by Margaret Gillman, circa 1903. The quilt features many different styles and varieties of flower embroidery including prominent satin roses. Second, a Pioneer Quilt by Dora Boles Frink, circa 1959. The quilt tells the story of Oregon in 32 embroidered blocks. The blocks depict animals and plants native to Oregon along with state buildings and pioneer scenes. The last block is of a woman at home ironing with a spinning wheel in the background.

Northern Shenandoah Valley Quilt Show


Greetings Fellow Quilters,
