Hello Quilters,

I hope you are enjoying your summertime and finding ways to beat the heat. I've been up in New Hampshire for July so enjoying beautiful, cooler weather and not looking forward to returning to the Maryland heat for August. I hope to see many of you at our August meeting where we will be playing Quilto and having an ice cream treat. We will be meeting in the Rosborough Center at Asbury where we met last year. Meeting starts at 7:30 pm but come early to check out all that is going on, check in and socialize a bit. I will send out a meeting reminder before the meeting, This is an in-person meeting only. We start up the Hybrid meetings with Zoom in September.

Just a few reminders and info from me this month:

- Have you renewed your membership yet? You can pay with cash, check or credit card before the meeting, cost is still \$35 and it is a little cheaper if you are out of state or an Asbury resident.
- How is your Summer Quilt Challenge "You've Got a Friend in Me" coming along? You have plenty of time to complete it since it's not due until October.
- Our 2027 raffle quilt is coming along nicely, Karen Moss did the long arming, and Trish McTighe is organizing the binding, appraisal and Montgomery County Fair entry. We hope to have it displayed for our September meeting when we will be passing out the raffle tickets. As a reminder, we voted for Red Wiggler Farm and Sunflower Bakery for our charity donation with a portion of the net proceeds from this quilt.
- The executive board voted in June to skip creating a quilt for 2028 and do one a year later for our 2029 quilt show to give the guild a break between quilt raffles. We are always looking for ideas and someone to organize the quilt creation so let me know if you have any thoughts or want to help with this next year.
- The Montgomery County Fair is happening August 14th to 22th. Senior day is Tuesday, August 18th and admission is free if you are 62 or older (parking is \$20 per car or take a free shuttle from Montgomery College in either Rockville or Germantown). Please check out all the quilts in the 4H building and look for the winner of the Best First Quilt as that award is sponsored by the Guild.
- The Piecemakers Mini-Group has volunteered to coordinate the Yard Sale for our Quilt Show. More about this soon but we hope to start collecting items in September. If you have some items now that you can't hold until then, let me know and I can hold them for you. Huge thanks to the Piecemakers for stepping up for this important task.
- The Quilt Show Committee is starting to form -- Michele Barnard, Trish McTighe and Anne Flaggs have volunteered to co-chair the committee. **Quilt show will be on Saturday/Sunday April 24th-25th, 2027** with set up on Friday, April 23rd. Specific details are still being worked out. Please consider joining this committee to help the guild have a successful show.
- **Save the date, our Fall Sew-In** is scheduled for Saturday/Sunday **November 7th-8th**.
- The next Executive Board meeting is currently scheduled for Monday, August 10th on Zoom at 7pm, but I may move it out a week to August 17th. Please let me or another officer know if you are interested in attending. As always, we welcome your suggestions and comments.

Hi, All. I hope you are having a great summer. It's been quite a challenge enduring the heat and the rain. But you may always escape to your happy place, i.e. your sewing room, and enjoy at least 15 minutes of pleasure. I also hope that you have had some time to work on the Friendship Star Summer Challenge, which is the Friendship Star challenge.

The guidelines for this challenge are quite simple. The quilt must include at least 1 friendship star. Of course, multiple stars would be nice, just so the one star is not so lonely. Every star should have friends, after all. The quilt size may be 36" square to twin size. The 36" size is a change from previous years, as that is the requested minimum quilt size of several of our recipient organizations. Quilts must be sandwiched, quilted and bound. All challenge quilts will be donated to Service Projects for distribution.

Take the challenge and use up a lot of scraps or stash. You will be helping FSQ support our Service Projects mission to provide quilts to hospitals, Comfort Cases, Project Linus, A Wider Circle and other worthwhile organizations.

Finished quilts are due at the October meeting by 7:15 pm. Voting will take place before the meeting and during the first 5 minutes of the break. \$10 gift certificates from Capital Quilts will be awarded to the three quilts with the most votes.

We can't wait to see what your imaginative spirits create. Have fun!

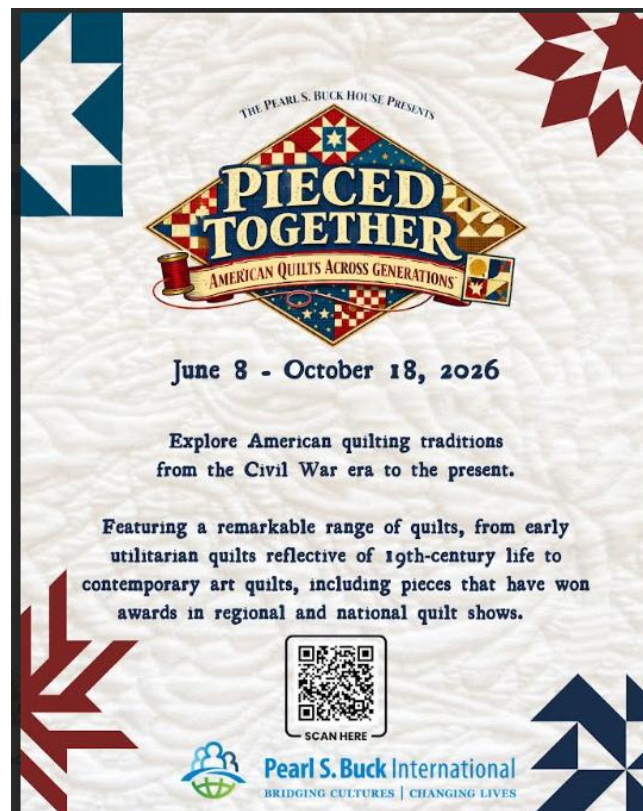

Pearl S. Buck House Museum

See the new exhibit opening in the Pearl S. Buck House Museum this summer, "Pieced Together: American Quilts Across Generations," a celebration of American art, culture, and history and an America 250 event.

Featuring 163 years of quilting history, the collection includes early utilitarian quilts from the 19th century alongside contemporary art quilts, including award-winning pieces from regional and national exhibitions. Each quilt highlights the evolution of design, technique, and cultural storytelling, offering insight into the changing role of quilting in American life. The quilts in this exhibit were crafted by both modern quilters and quilting guilds, using both modern and vintage patterns and materials, as well as family heirloom quilts, handed down generation to generation over the course of decades and even centuries.

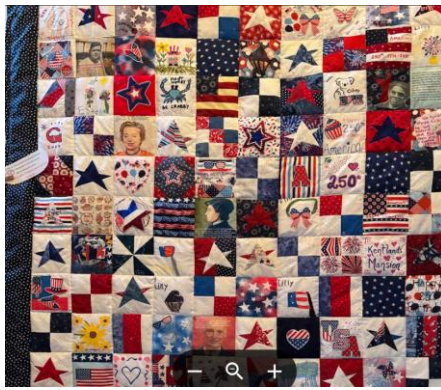
This five-month, mystery-style quilt along invites quilters and anyone interested in quilting to sew along. You don't need to be an expert quilter to participate. ([more info](#))
