Guild Meeting Minutes – August 2026

Due to late arrivals and some miscommunication regarding setup, the ice cream social started at 7:25 pm. Unfortunately, the timing shift meant the secretary needed to leave prior to the start of the business meeting,

President Anne Flaggs was unable to attend, so Co-Treasurer Judy Walsh called the meeting to order at 7:45 pm. There was 1 guest (Rachel) and 3 new members (Annette Montone, Ann Roebuck and Maureen Graves).

General Business:

Two minor corrections were made to the June minutes prior to the meeting. There were no corrections at the meeting and the minutes were approved.

Members were reminded of several upcoming quilting events, including the Mid-Atlantic Shop Hop, the Montgomery County Agricultural Fair, the Pennsylvania National Quilt Extravaganza, and the Original Sewing & Quilt Expo.

The 2027 raffle quilt (Diamond Cabana) will debut at the September meeting, when raffle tickets will become available. It will also be displayed at the Montgomery County Fair. Thanks were extended to everyone who helped create the quilt. A portion of the proceeds will benefit Sunflower Bakery and Red Wiggler Farms.

The Executive Board meeting has been moved to Monday, August 17 at 7:00 p.m. via Zoom. Members with agenda items or who wish to attend should contact Anne Flaggs.

Thanks were expressed to Jenn Pye and Rosie Hormuth for completing the financial audit in June. No issues were found.

The Fall Sew-In is scheduled for November 7–8. Planning is underway, and volunteers will be contacted. Signups will begin in September.

The announcement that the Piecemakers mini group will organize the Yard Sale at the April quilt show was met with cheers and applause. Volunteers will be needed for fabric-folding workdays. Thanks were given to those who have already volunteered.

The 2027 Quilt Show is scheduled for Saturday and Sunday April 24–25, with Michele Barnard, Trish McTighe, and Anne Flaggs serving as co-chairs. Setup will be on Friday April 23rd.

The Quiltline – September 2026

There will be no Service Project workshops in August since the church is using the meeting room for summer camps. Appreciation was expressed to those who participated in the July pillowcase drive organized by Jane Phillips for Comfort Cases. More than 100 pillowcases were gifted to foster teens attending a sleep-away camp.

Quilty News:

Judy indicated that several members shared a variety of quilting news and tips in the August newsletter:

There was a nice photo of the completed Montgomery County USA 250 Quilt. Thanks were expressed to all members who contributed by sewing blocks for this quilt.

Michele Barnard indicated that The Artists & Makers Studio Show with the Woodturners will run from November 4th to the 24th. Some FSQ members have already expressed interest. She requested anyone who is interested in participating to please send her an email.

Lorie Coston's new FSQ To-Do Checklist is a great way to remind yourself of many guild activities in which you can participate. Lorie said a copy of her list is available for download on the Home page of our website.

Committee Announcements:

Carrie Horton said the membership drive is going well and 100 members have already paid their dues for this year. She reminded everyone that they can pay by cash, check or credit card.

Colleen Biasco announced that the 2027 Retreat at Bon Secours planned for February 12–15 is sold out and a waitlist has been started. Contact Coleen if you'd like to be included on the waitlist.

JoAnne DuChez reminded everyone that the "You've Got a Friend in Me" Service Project Challenge entries are due at our October meeting. Quilt sizes are 36" x 36" up to twin size. Fortunately, there's still plenty of time to get your quilt finished.

Michele Barnard, one of the Quilt Show Co-chairs, said volunteers will be needed to chair or co-chair various committees for the 2027 Quilt Show. She briefly described several positions and encouraged everyone to get involved because "There can't be a quilt show if we don't have enough volunteers." Michele also indicated there will be a quilt show meeting in September. Kimberly Strong asked for more information about the Scavenger Hunt and then volunteered to chair that committee.

The Piecemakers did not have a report yet about their plans for the Yard Sale at the Quilt Show, but more information will be forthcoming.

A question was raised about who to contact about donating items for raffle baskets. Heidi Oestreicher indicated she and Elaine Vilforth are the co-chairs for that.

Only 1 month left to finish your challenge quilt. So, I had better get busy quilting mine. I hope that you have had a fun time working on your Friendship Star Summer Challenge, which is the "Friendship Star Challenge." Your time is helping a very good cause, our own FSQ Service Projects mission to provide quilts to hospitals, Comfort Cases, Project Linus, A Wider Circle and other worthwhile organizations.

The guidelines for this challenge are quite simple. The quilt must include at least 1 friendship star. Of course, multiple stars would be nice, just so the one star is not so lonely. Every star should have friends, after all. The quilt size may be 36" square to twin size. The 36" size is a change from previous years, as that is the requested minimum quilt size of several of our recipient organizations. Quilts must be sandwiched, quilted and bound.

All challenge quilts will be donated to Service Projects for distribution.

Finished quilts are due at the October meeting by 7:15 pm. Voting will take place before the meeting and during the first 5 minutes of the break. \$10 gift certificates from Capital Quilts will be awarded to the three quilts with the most votes.

We can't wait to see what your imaginative spirits create. Have fun!

What is a Sew-in?

It's an opportunity to get the guild together to sew and spend time together outside of our meetings and service projects. We did this in April and it was a lot of fun and we all got to talk with some of the members that we wouldn't normally have a chance to interact with. This is similar to our annual retreat at Bon Secours where we pay a larger fee, spend a few nights and sew together for a long weekend while being pampered with food and a room of our own to sleep in but on a much smaller scale and more affordable. The basic idea of the Sew-in is to have a weekend sewing event for the day on Saturday and Sunday. We rent the community room in Asbury with tables for sewing (both machine and hand). Pearl S. Buck House Museum

See the new exhibit opening in the Pearl S. Buck House Museum this summer, "Pieced Together: American Quilts Across Generations," a celebration of American art, culture, and history and an America 250 event.

Featuring 163 years of quilting history, the collection includes early utilitarian quilts from the 19th century alongside contemporary art quilts, including award-winning pieces from regional and national exhibitions. Each quilt highlights the evolution of design, technique, and cultural storytelling, offering insight into the changing role of quilting in American life. The quilts in this exhibit were crafted by both modern quilters and quilting guilds, using both modern and vintage patterns and materials, as well as family heirloom quilts, handed down generation to generation over the course of decades and even centuries.

"Pieced Together" opens June 8 at the Pearl S. Buck House Museum, located at 520 Dublin Road in Perkasié, Bucks County, Pennsylvania, 18944 (about an hour north of Philadelphia). Tickets are on sale now at <https://pearlsbuckinternational.ticketspice.com/quilt-exhibit>.

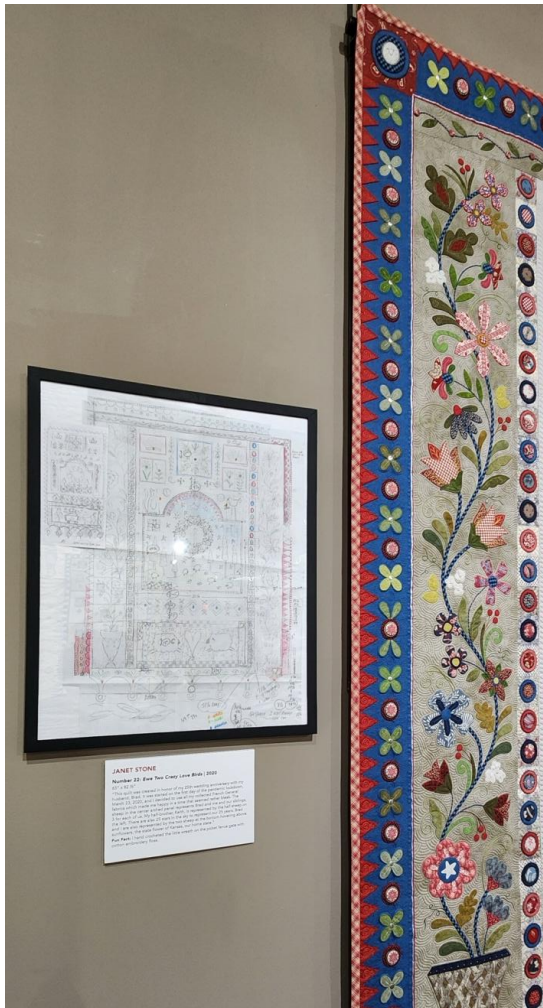
Janet Stone at the National Quilt Museum

This July, my daughter and I took a weekend trip to Paducah, KY to visit the National Quilt Museum. I have been a huge fan of Janet Stone's alphabet quilts through the years. When I heard that the NQM would have all 26 of the quilts together for the first time, I knew it was time to return to Kentucky. My daughter went to Murray State University, and I visited Paducah as often as I could during those four years. Jennifer Rossmere and I also attended an AQS show there one year. We flew into Nashville on Saturday, picked up the rental car and drove directly to Hancock's of Paducah for some fabric shopping. Since the store closed at 3, I had only 35 minutes to shop, have the fabric cut and pay. Hancock's of Paducah is a huge store with fabric sorted by manufacturer, with an entire back room full of hundreds of pre-cuts and kits. As you can guess, half an hour was not much time to spend there at all.

Sunday afternoon was spent at the National Quilt Museum. They have a great variety rotating shows and a corner devoted strictly to miniature quilts. Janet Stone's exhibit was incredible! Her attention to detail and color combinations are so inspiring. Plus, she does all of her free motion quilting on a domestic machine. Included with many of her quilts were the original sketches Janet drew. Three of her 26 quilts were doubled sided. Also at the museum was a great Tula Pink exhibit. Tula is an amazing illustrator!

I have included some close-up photos, though I do not have the exact names of the quilts. Paducah & the National Quilt Museum are the perfect long weekend getaway destinations.



Janet Stone has the complete alphabet on each quilt, whether each letter is made with fabric, is a button or a bead. Many of her quilts feature a sheep or two. She has collected sheep for years.





Tula Pink does not disappoint. Her drawings and quilts are so much fun to look at.
